Glad You Asked That

Throughout the year we noticed a steady negative balance in the weekly contributions in the bulletin. How did Saint Patrick Parish finish the fiscal year (July 2015 - June 2016)?

In terms of the bulletin weekly collection tally, we ended up \$98,000 short of our goal of \$1,073,000. What does that mean for the parish? Are we hurting financially? The best way to answer that is "Yes" and "No."

First of all, thank you for your continued generosity to your parish community. Though our weekly collections did not meet expectations, other sources of income and close management of our expenses helped reduce the overall year end shortage to \$72,000. The shortage was not unexpected. The Archdiocese informed us that whenever parishes change leadership, they can expect to see up to a 10% drop in attendance and contributions. More challenging than this most recent shortage in contributions is the steady decline in attendance at Saint Patrick (and throughout the Catholic Church in America) for the past 10 years. Our average weekly Mass attendance in 2006 was 1088, compared to 815 for 2016.

In terms of our shortfall and its direct impact on the parish, we are fortunate to have a Parish savings account which enabled us to meet our financial obligations. However, we realize negative years like this are not sustainable over time. Nevertheless, we remain optimistic and trust in the Lord that things are moving in the right direction.

Our plan moving forward to address these challenges (in consultation with the Finance Council and other parish leaders and staff) is two-fold:

- (1) **Outreach** Attract and welcome new members to join us at Saint Patrick. Cultural Catholicism is no longer filling our pews.
- (2) Better communication to parishioners about our individual fiscal responsibility to our church. If Saint Patrick Parish is going to continue growing into the kind of church community God is calling us to be, we all need to be willing to provide the necessary resources, to the best of our individual ability.


Altar Server Training

All 25 Pierce Deanery parishes have committed to support the building of Pope Francis' Jubilee House calling upon Christian stewardship of treasure and talent.

Anyone can come out and work on the build site on any Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and/or Saturday.

Saint Patrick Catholic Church and School's designated work week is September 14 – 17, 2016. Chip McCullough, parishioner, member of the Knights of Columbus Tacoma Council 809 and active Habitat for Humanity volunteer is coordinating the efforts at the parish. Our goal is to have at least 10 volunteers at the build site everyday.

Those age 16 or older are able to work on the house. No construction experience is needed. There is something everyone can do. Younger people can help with landscaping.

All first-time volunteers are required to attend an orientation. A New Volunteer Orientation is scheduled for Saturday, September 10, 2016 in the Church Hall for 6:30 p.m. or immediately following 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. The presentation is about 1 hour.
