Fasting and Abstinence

Beginning on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays during Lent, all persons fourteen and older are bound by the law of abstinence (ie. no meat). On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, all those who are eighteen, and not yet fifty-nine years old, are also bound by the law of fasting. (ie., one main meal, two small meals and nothing in between).

Tax Fraud

We have started to received a few reports from St. Patrick employees and volunteers who have discovered that acts of fraud have been committed on their 2014 tax returns related to last year's Archdiocese data breach. According to the IRS, the best way to protect yourself from tax fraud on your 2014 return is to file your return as early as possible. This will help minimize the likelihood that a criminal can file a false return in your identity. Filing an extension early will not have the same effect; the return must be filed.

Lent in the Atrium

At the very beginning of Lent we 'bury' the Alleluia (papers with the word "Alleluia" beautifully decorated by the children). We change our prayer corner cloth to purple. Purple or rose is the color the Church uses to represent this waiting time. During Lent we pray with the parable of the Good Shepherd, remembering that we are called by name and loved by God. The cenacle, also known as the Upper Room, is a favorite work for the children. During Lent, we help children learn about the location of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection by showing the City of Jerusalem. We celebrate the Last Supper by reenacting it and hearing, once again, the words of love that Jesus gave us at this meal,

"Take, and eat, this is my body, broken for you. Take and drink, this is my blood, poured out for you. Do this in memory of me."

The children are so filled with joy and peace when they have their time in the atrium to work with these materials.

All volunteers must read and agree to follow the policies and procedures set forth in these following documents: "Policy for the Prevention of and Response to Sexual Abuse, Sexual Misconduct and Sexual Harassment" - "Code of Professional conduct for Church Personnel" and "Reporting Suspected Abuse or Neglect of Minors and Vulnerable Adults." You will find these policies on the Seattle Archdiocesan website. Experience God's mercy in the sacrament of penance and reconciliation

Friday Evenings during Lent, 6:00 - 7:00 p.m. Saturday, 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.

"God never tires of forgiving us, and through the ministry of a priest he offers us an embrace that regenerates us and allows us to continue in our journey." Pope Francis

"Peace be with you!" With these words, the risen Lord greeted his frightened apostles on the day of his resurrection. They were troubled, anxious and fearful — much like us at certain points in our lives. Christ repeated the words, "Peace be with you." But then he added, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them." (John 20:19-23)

The Lord Jesus was proclaiming that his crucifixion and death had made the gifts of salvation and forgiveness available to all. In the sacrament of penance and reconciliation, also called confession, we meet the Lord, who wants to give us his gift of forgiveness and the grace to live a renewed life in him. Confession is such an important gift of grace that every Catholic is obliged to confess serious sins at least once a year. The church encourages more frequent confession as a means to let ourselves be healed by Christ, to grow spiritually and to progress in the life of the Spirit.

In this sacrament of mercy, we seek the grace of forgiveness and the strength to let go of patterns of behavior that prevent us from knowing, loving and serving the Lord Jesus fully. Our Holy Father Pope Francis has said of this sacrament, "When the door starts closing a bit because of our weakness and sins, confession reopens it."

Don't worry if it's been a long time since your last confession or if you are uncertain about how to approach the Lord in this sacrament. "The light is on for you." If "the door" has closed a bit for you, parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Seattle are inviting you to let the Lord reopen it.

Jesus wants you to receive his peace, just as he wanted his apostles to receive it. Celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation this Lent and experience God's tender mercy.

The sacrament of penance and reconciliation is a rich source of grace.	How to go to confession You may make your confession face-to-face or	
 Also known as confession, it was instituted by Jesus Christ to offer us forgiveness for offenses committed against God. Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people and God. In the sacrament of reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and his church. We express our sorrow in a meaningful way, receive the forgiveness of Christ and his church, make reparation for what we have done and resolve to do better in the future. The sacrament involves five elements: Contrition: We are sincerely sorry for offending God and have a firm resolve not to repeat our sins. Confession: We speak about our sins aloud to a priest. Penance: The priest prescribes an act of penance as 	 anonymously. 2. When you enter, the priest welcomes you with a blessing or greeting. 3. Make the sign of the cross and say, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. My last confession was [give weeks, months or years] ago." 4. Confess all of your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help.) 5. Say, "I am sorry for these and all of my sins." 6. The priest assigns a penance and offers advice to help you be a better Catholic. 7. Say an act of contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. 8. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins. 	
 a part of our healing. Act of contrition: We offer a prayer in which we express to God our sorrow for sin (see example below). Absolution: The priest says the words through which "God, the Father of mercies" reconciles a sinner to himself through the merits of the cross and grants his forgiveness. 	Sample act of contrition My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.


