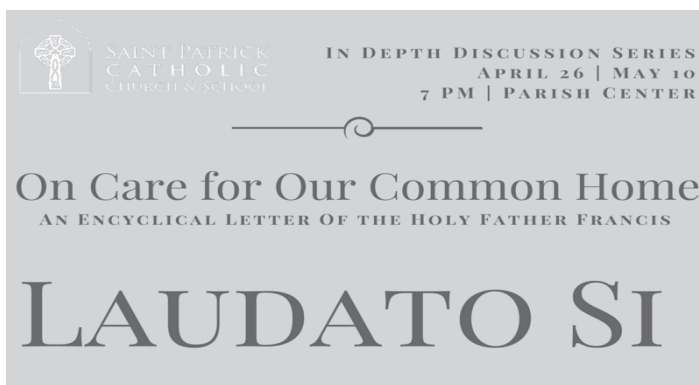

"Assisted suicide may sound like it provides choices for individuals, but instead, it's taking choices away from people by radically weakening the promise of care and support at the end of life for terminally ill patients like me" - one of Maggie's insights.

Volunteer Training

There are many opportunities to volunteer at St. Patrick Catholic Church and School. In trying to make it as easy as possible for our parishioners to do so, the following must be completed:

1. Background Checks

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnerable adults are required to complete a background check every three years.

Screening is also required from any volunteer with access to cash, checks or other negotiables.

2. Policies

All volunteers are required to read and sign the Policy for the Prevention of and Response to Sexual Abuse, Code of Professional Conduct, and Reporting Suspected Abuse of Minors and Vulnerable Adults.

3. Safe Environment Training

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnerable adults are required to complete the Protecting God's Children course within 90 days of beginning service. Current volunteers are required to take updated online training courses every three years.

We will be hosting in the Parish Center the "Protecting God's Children" class for new volunteers on Wednesday, April 27th beginning at 6:30 p.m. To attend this class you must log-on to

VirtusOnline.org to register and establish an account with the Archdiocese and follow the steps to becoming compliant with all Safe Environment requirements.


All **current employees and volunteers** who have already completed the Safe Environment requirements will be automatically transferred into the new database. VIRTUS sent log-on information to every current participant in August. Those who have already attended a Called to Protect for Ministries class will not be required to take the VIRTUS foundation class, Protecting God's Children. These individuals will be notified by VIRTUS when it is time to renew their background check and/or take an online refresher course, which is now required every three years.

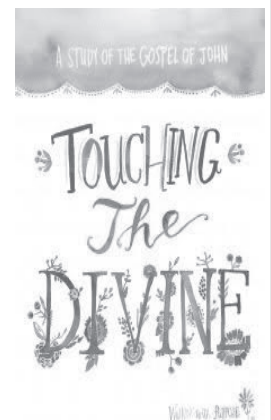


Walking with Purpose

Statement by Archbishop of Seattle J. Peter Sartain On the papal exhortation *Amoris Laetitia* (The Joy of Love)

I am deeply grateful to Pope Francis for the teaching
 and pastoral care he has provided the Church and
 all people in his apostolic exhortation,
Amoris Laetitia (The Joy of Love).

The depth and breadth of this teaching on love in the
 family, which follows the recent Synod on the
 Family, is extensive, and I urge all Catholics and
 everyone to heed the pope's suggestion and to
 study the document in the weeks and months
 ahead. In the opening lines of this love letter to
 families, the pope states that "The joy of love
 experienced by families is also the joy of the
 Church." Pope Francis set the tone for his
 teaching document by reminding the Church and all
 people of the great joy and grace that are
 experienced in marriage and within families.

He also provides a context for the entire Church -
 bishops, priests, religious, lay leaders and families
 themselves - to meet the very real challenges facing
 marriage and the family today. The pope does not
 sidestep the challenges and he has invited all of us
 to meet them with a spirit of love. "The Joy of Love"
 is a document of hope. It reminds us of the great
 blessing married couples and families bestow on all
 of society. Precisely because the health of marriage
 and families are so important to the wellbeing of
 society, this document deserves careful
 consideration to determine how its teaching can be
 implemented for the common good. The pope's
 words should inspire all of us, especially married
 couples, to grow in love and to see marriage and
 family life as a mission of love in service to the
 world.

In the months ahead, we will be studying the pope's
 pastoral exhortation to discern how on the
 archdiocesan and parish level we should be
 strengthening and improving the pastoral care we
 give to couples as they prepare for marriage, as they
 seek to deepen their married love through the years,
 as they care for their children, and as they face
 difficulties in their marriage.

Pope Francis has given us a teaching of Hope in
 God's grace and mercy in all of life's joys and
 challenges.

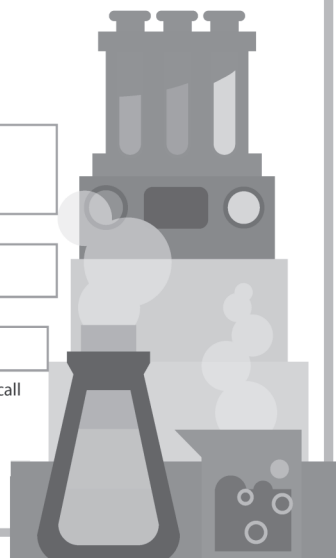

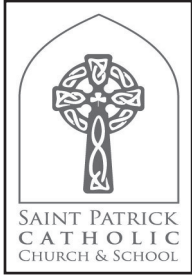
