

**Weekly Contributions - Stewardship of Treasure**

Today marks the first appearance of our traditional Weekend Contributions Report. This is the tool we use to let parishioners know whether we are on track to generate the financial resources needed to provide all the programs and services related to our mission as Church.

Please note that the new weekly target - \$20,643 - is an increase from last year's target - \$19,327. The reasons for the increase are twofold. Contributions the past two years have not met expectations, and we have had to dip into our parish savings to balance both the parish and school budgets. After much discussion and reflection, our Finance Council felt that an increase was needed to ready us for the future. This new weekly target will enable us to preserve and slowly grow our parish savings account to prepare us for expected and unexpected events. The increase also supports staffing changes we've made during the transition that will help increase attendance, engagement, and financial support for our parish.

In years past, funds for major maintenance and up-keep were generated through bequests or capital campaigns. A more sound financial practice is to steadily build a reserve fund from more consistent and reliable sources and re-investment of savings.

As you can see, we've got some catching up to do. Through the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of our fiscal year we are \$43,000 short of our year-to-date goal. Please prayerfully consider what you can do to ensure we receive the resources necessary for St. Patrick to continue being a “full service Catholic parish.”

Each year we look forward to our Easter celebration with joy as the pinnacle moment of our Catholic faith.


A powerful part of our Easter Vigil celebration includes the initiation of our fellow parishioners who have made the decision to become a part of our Catholic community.

may we suggest...


- Relax! God put the wiggle in children; Don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house. All are welcome!
- Do prepare your child ahead of time by modeling joy at the opportunity to worship God in this community.
- Sit toward the front where it is easier to see and hear.
- Quietly explain the parts of the Mass.
- Sing the hymns loudly, pray, and voice the responses with enthusiasm. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.
- If your child becomes particularly disruptive, feel free to leave Mass, but please come back. As Jesus said: "Let the children come to me."
- Trust the environment of the Mass and our community to form your child over time.
- Please do not bring food or drink into the church unless they are medically indicated. Please do not bring electronic Games into Church. Please do not use the pew envelopes or other materials for artwork.
- Remember the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God, to Christ and to one another. Let them know that they are home in this house of worship.





## Volunteer Training

**There are many opportunities to volunteer at St. Patrick Catholic Church and School. In trying to make it as easy as possible for our parishioners to do so, the following must be completed:**

### **1. Background Checks**

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnerable adults are required to complete a background check every three years. Screening is also required from any volunteer with access to cash, checks or other negotiables.

### **2. Policies**

All volunteers are required to read and sign the Policy for the Prevention of and Response to Sexual Abuse, Code of Professional Conduct, and Reporting Suspected Abuse of Minors and Vulnerable Adults.

### **3. Safe Environment Training**

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnerable adults are required to complete the Protecting God's Children course. Current volunteers are required to take updated online training courses every three years.

**We will be hosting in the Parish Center the "Protecting God's Children" class for new volunteers on Tuesday, November 10<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:30 p.m. To attend this class you must log-on to: [VirtusOnline.org](http://VirtusOnline.org) to register and establish an account with the Archdiocese and follow the steps to becoming compliant with all Safe Environment requirements.**

All **current employees and volunteers** who have already completed the Safe Environment requirements will be automatically transferred into the new database. VIRTUS sent log-on information to every current participant in August. Those who have already attended a Called to Protect for Ministries class will not be required to take the VIRTUS foundation class, Protecting God's Children. These individuals will be notified by VIRTUS when it is time to renew their background check and/or take an online refresher course, which is now required every three years.



## Glad You Asked That

### **A family member recently died. How do I go about making funeral arrangements?**

Please accept our heartfelt condolences. Our parish staff is here to help you in this time of loss. Mary Randall is our Pastoral Assistant for funerals and will help the family make funeral Mass arrangements. Please call the Parish Center at 253-383-2783. Mary will then coordinate with Father Jerry Graham, S.J., who has agreed to be the presider for funeral Masses. Before we can commit to a particular funeral date we need to confirm Fr. Jerry's availability. As has been our practice in the past, the days for funeral Masses and services are Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Services typically begin at 11:00 a.m. in the Church followed by a reception in the Church Hall. We have a wonderful Funeral Receptions Ministry Team that is available to assist with the reception (if the family wishes). The interment follows the reception at the cemetery (if the family desires a graveside service on the same day as the funeral).

Many of you may not know that Deacon Bill Eckert is permitted to celebrate a Catholic funeral that does not include a Mass. We encourage you to consider whether this option of Deacon Bill presiding at your family funeral works best for your situation. Deacon Bill is a full-time teacher at Bellarmine Prep, which may impact his availability during the school year. Please contact the parish office if you have any questions.


