

September 19th and September 20th.**

**Those whom the community has designated to serve as catechists
will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry.**

Catechetical Sunday is an invitation to reflect on the role that each person plays,
by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel.

Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of
faith. Catechists from the following groups will be called forward:

R.C.I.A., ReMembering Church, and the Children's RCIA; Baptism, First Reconciliation
and First Communion, Confirmation, Youth Ministry, teachers at Saint Patrick Catholic School,
Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, Young Adult Ministry, Adult Bible Study,
Family Based Catechesis, Vacation Bible School,
Walking with Purpose, Men's Prayer Group and Children's Rosary Group.

On Catechetical Sunday, we not only honor and bless those whom the community
has designated to serve as catechists.

In addition, we honor and bless the role of parents, grandparents, and guardians
in their role as primary catechists of their children.

Volunteer Training

**There are many opportunities to volunteer at St. Patrick Catholic
Church and School. In trying to make it as easy as possible for
our parishioners to do so, the following must be completed:**

1. Background Checks

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnera-
ble adults are required to complete a background check every three
years. Screening is also required from any volunteer with access to
cash, checks or other negotiables.

2. Policies

All volunteers are required to read and sign the Policy for the Prevention of and Response to Sexual Abuse,
Code of Professional Conduct, and Reporting Suspected Abuse of Minors and Vulnerable Adults.

3. Safe Environment Training

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnerable adults are required to complete the
Protecting God's Children course within 90 days of beginning service . Current volunteers are required to
take updated online training courses every three years.

We will be hosting in the **school's library** the "**Protecting God's Children**" class for **new volun-
teers on Wednesday, September 23rd beginning at 6:30 p.m.** To attend this class you must log-on to
VirtusOnline.org to register and establish an account with the Archdiocese and follow the steps to becoming
compliant with all Safe Environment requirements.

All **current employees and volunteers** who have already completed the Safe Environment requirements
will be automatically transferred into the new database. VIRTUS sent log-on information to every current par-
ticipant in August. Those who have already attended a Called to Protect for Ministries class will not be re-
quired to take the VIRTUS foundation class, Protecting God's Children. These individuals will be notified by
VIRTUS when it is time to renew their background check and/or take an online refresher course, which is
now required every three years.

Glad You Asked That! - Frequently Asked Questions Installment #7

Question - Who will be available for weddings and funerals?

Answer -

Unbeknownst to many of you, Deacon Bill is empowered to preside over Weddings and Funerals. The difference is that he cannot celebrate Mass as part of these Sacraments. Father Jerry Graham, S.J., will be the lead parish priest for funerals that include a Mass. Father Jerry Chapdelaine, S.J., will be the lead parish priest for weddings that include a Mass. Please contact the Parish Center as soon as possible to make arrangements for a wedding or a funeral. Since we no longer have a resident Pastor, there might be a slight delay in arranging for these Sacraments for those wishing to incorporate a Mass with the wedding or funeral. We appreciate your patience and understanding and strongly encourage you to consider Deacon Bill to preside over weddings or funerals.

Question - Why are the Pastoral Council and Stewardship Commission merging?

Answer -

This change will promote greater transparency and more effectiveness for both groups. The role of the Pastoral Council is to help establish the mission and vision for the parish and to be the eyes and ears of the community. The Stewardship Commission focuses on parish efforts to help parishioners share their Time, Talent and Treasure in ways that enhance the overall engagement level of our community. The two groups will work in concert with each other to develop the long-term strategic plan for the parish. All parish councils, commissions and ministry groups will be asked to set goals for the coming year.


Visitation School 90th Anniversary
