3. Not baptized in any faith





**Those whom the community has designated to serve as catechists  
will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry.**

Catechetical Sunday is an invitation to reflect on the role that each person plays,  
by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel.

Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of  
faith. Catechists from the following groups will be called forward:

R.C.I.A., ReMembering Church, and the Children's RCIA; Baptism, First Reconciliation  
and First Communion, Confirmation, Youth Ministry, teachers at Saint Patrick Catholic School,  
Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, Young Adult Ministry, Adult Bible Study,  
Family Based Catechesis, Vacation Bible School,  
Walking with Purpose, Men's Prayer Group and Children's Rosary Group.

On Catechetical Sunday, we not only honor and bless those whom the community  
has designated to serve as catechists.

In addition, we honor and bless the role of parents, grandparents, and guardians  
in their role as primary catechists of their children.

## Volunteer Training

**There are many opportunities to volunteer at St. Patrick Catholic  
Church and School. In trying to make it as easy as possible for  
our parishioners to do so, the following must be completed:**

### **1. Background Checks**

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnera-  
ble adults are required to complete a background check every three  
years. Screening is also required from any volunteer with access to  
cash, checks or other negotiables.

### **2. Policies**

All volunteers are required to read and sign the Policy for the Prevention of and Response to Sexual Abuse,  
Code of Professional Conduct, and Reporting Suspected Abuse of Minors and Vulnerable Adults.

### **3. Safe Environment Training**

Volunteers with unsupervised, ongoing access to minors and vulnerable adults are required to complete the  
Protecting God's Children course within 90 days of beginning service . Current volunteers are required to  
take updated online training courses every three years.

We will be hosting in the **school's library** the "**Protecting God's Children**" class for **new volun-  
teers on Wednesday, September 23<sup>rd</sup> beginning at 6:30 p.m.** To attend this class you must log-on to  
VirtusOnline.org to register and establish an account with the Archdiocese and follow the steps to becoming  
compliant with all Safe Environment requirements.

All **current employees and volunteers** who have already completed the Safe Environment requirements  
will be automatically transferred into the new database. VIRTUS sent log-on information to every current par-  
ticipant in August. Those who have already attended a Called to Protect for Ministries class will not be re-  
quired to take the VIRTUS foundation class, Protecting God's Children. These individuals will be notified by  
VIRTUS when it is time to renew their background check and/or take an online refresher course, which is  
now required every three years.

### **Administration – Serving the Lord**

**Office Helpers** – an opportunity to help with office needs as they arise.

**Office “Special Project” Helpers** – an opportunity to help as projects arise.

**Child Care Provider** – an opportunity to babysit our young as needs arise.

**“One Time Event” Planners** - an opportunity to implement one event per year.

**Faith Formation** - Inviting (Evangelizing)

**St. Patrick School** – an opportunity for men and women to work for the school in a variety of volunteer roles.

**Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** – a sensorial rich experience for children 3-12 years of age that gives children the opportunity to grow in love and knowledge of God.

**Parents of Preschoolers (MOP's – DOP's)** - to foster love and support for parents of infants and toddlers with social hour and prayer as part of their gatherings.

**Pastoral Council** – an organized consultant group of men and women advisors for the Parish Coordinator

**PrimeTimers** – a ministry designed for single men and women over 50 years of age for social interaction that centers around sharing meals.

**Senior Ministries XYZ** – a ministry that provides an opportunity for men and women age 60 and older to meet for Mass and lunch on the First Fridays of each month, September through May.

**Young Professionals** – this ministry provides social and faith opportunities for women and men ages 22 to 35.

**Welcoming Committee** – This ministry provides an opportunity for new persons to register with our faith community, and to learn more about the many ministries and programs we offer as a parish.

**Facilities and Grounds** – Serving the Lord

**Handymen's Maintenance Team** – a ministry that helps with fixing and restoring objects for both the Church and Parish Center.

**Snow Shovelers** – persons willing to help shovel Church and Parish Center sidewalks and parking lots when needed.

**Garden Ministry** – persons willing to help with weed pulling and plantings as needs arise with our school and parish.

## **Liturgy and Music Ministry –Thanking (Praising the Lord)**

**Altar Server Helper** – persons interested in assisting the training of altar servers.

**Altar Linens** – a ministry that helps keep our altar linens washed and ironed.

**Arts and Environment** – a ministry that provides opportunity for those artistically gifted in preparing our Church environment throughout the liturgical seasons.

**Children’s Liturgy of the Word** – a ministry that offers our young children ages 3-5 and 5 to 12 years of age, an opportunity to hear the Word of God in age appropriate, based on the readings from our Sunday Masses. No registration is required. An opportunity, too, for adults to become facilitators/leaders.

**Daily Mass Set-up** - a ministry that provides opportunity for men and women to be lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and to set-up and clean-up for daily Mass at 7:45 a.m.

**Eucharistic Adoration** – a ministry that provides an opportunity to spend quiet time with the Lord with exposure of the Consecrated Host on the altar of our Chapel.

**Eucharistic Ministers** – a ministry that provides opportunity for men and women to serve Consecrated hosts and Consecrated wine during our weekend liturgies and other times of Eucharistic celebrations.

**Greeters** – a ministry that greets our parishioners and visitors at our weekend liturgies and other times of liturgical celebrations.

**Lectors** – a ministry that provides opportunity for men and women readers to proclaim the Word of God at all of our weekend liturgies and other times of liturgical celebrations.

**Music Ministry** - a ministry that provides opportunity for men and women who can sing well to join our choirs, and/or cantor at our weekend liturgies as well as at other liturgical celebrations.

**Ushers** – a ministry that offers opportunity for men and women to serve in the capacity of greeting and seating our parishioners and visitors while providing a safe environment during our weekend liturgies and other times of liturgical celebrations.

## **Ministry of Sacraments - Inviting / Thanking / Serving**

**Confirmation** – celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with St. Patrick’s Parish. Must be 16 years of age by Confirmation date to participate. Classes begin in September.

**Adult Confirmation** – Celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation as an adult by attending classes where learning and sharing faith is part of the preparation process.

**First Eucharist** – preparation for the sacrament that enables children to partake in the Holy Eucharist. Also called First Communion.

**First Reconciliation** – preparation for sacrament that enables children to receive God’s forgiveness. Also called Confession.

**Infant Baptism** – an opportunity for babies to be baptized at our weekend liturgies. Parents participate in classes to prepare for this Sacrament for their child.

## **Outreach – Serving / Inviting( Evangelizing)**

**Health Ministry** – a ministry that provides an opportunity to help with health education and other opportunities for mental and physical well being for our parishioners.

**Knights of Columbus** – a ministry (organization) for men giving them opportunity to serve/invite/thank/and give to our parishioners in a variety of ways.

**Respect Life** - a that provides an opportunity to work on all of life’s issues beginning with life in the womb through all human stages of life.

**Sister Parish** – a ministry that affords the opportunity to make connections with our Sister Parish in Bogota, Columbia.

**Social Justice** – a ministry that provides both education and opportunities for engaging in social justice issues.

**St. Vincent de Paul** – this ministry provides opportunity help serve the needs of the poor within our parish boundaries.

**Men’s Prayer Group** - a ministry for men of all ages that centers on prayer and faith discussions concerning a man’s role in regard to family life, work, and community.

**Prayer Chain Ministry** – a ministry that prays for special requests.

**Prayer Shawl Ministry** - a ministry for men and women to make prayer shawls for anyone in need.

**Spiritual Formation** – Inviting (evangelizing)

**Adult Bible Study** – a ministry that provides opportunity for men and women to come together and study Scripture for purpose of learning and living the Gospel as a way of life.

**Adult Faith Formation** – for those seeking more information on the sacraments and/or the RCIA process.

**Benedictine Spirituality** – a ministry that provides opportunity to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, learn the art of Lectio Divina (holy reading) and practice hospitality based on the Holy Rule of Saint Benedict of Nursia.


**Spiritual Growth Opportunities:** For those who wish to attend retreats, workshops, and listen to guest speakers to nourish the soul.


