Volunteers who prepare the church for the celebration of the Mass serve the daily Mass ministry.

Volunteers unlock the church and prepare for Mass, setting the altar with the vessels for bread, wine and water.

The volunteers in the Daily Mass Ministry serve as Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors for Mass.

The Rosary, led by the volunteers is recited after Mass.

At Mass with the school children, teachers serve as Eucharistic Ministers and the children serve as Lectors and bring up the Gifts.

After Mass, the vessels are purified and the church is locked.
