

Saint Patrick Parish–Annual Report–2014-2015

SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES

LITURGY



In addition to our weekend liturgies, we also celebrated Evening Prayer, Men's Prayer Group, Adoration, Rosary after daily Mass, and Stations of the Cross during Lent. Many people were involved in our liturgical ministries: Eucharistic ministers, lectors, altar servers, ushers, and choirs.

SACRAMENTS

We had 51 Baptisms during the past year, 26 infants, 18 children/youth, and 7 adults. The RCIA/RCIC programs welcomed 29 people into the Catholic Church. Forty-three students received First Eucharist; there were 50 Confirmations. Approximately 380 people attended our communal parish and school Reconciliation services; about 288 individual confessions were heard. Sixteen couples received the sacrament of Marriage. Anointing of the Sick was administered to 300 individuals, and 200 at communal services. Thirty-four funerals were celebrated during the year.



PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

One-hundred eight students, and 16 volunteers, participated in Family-Based Catechesis and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd religious education programs. Each Sunday, approximately 80 children, under the direction of parish leaders, participated in the Children's Liturgy of the Word. Approximately 20-40 active young people joined for each Youth Group function. Sixty-nine children, and 25 volunteers, participated in the Vacation Bible School. We also had the Women's Walking with Purpose group (bible study), and the Adult Bible Study group.



OUR SCHOOL

Three-hundred sixty-nine students welcomed Chris Gavin as the new principal of Saint Patrick Catholic School. Other new faces included teachers — Barbara Bolanos, Ashley Salber-Power, Lacey Heinz, Maria Lewis and Gail Harrison; lunch team members — Jen Peranzi, Kauleen Crisostomo, Kerry McAllister, Tracy Knight and Diah Evans; Extended Care assistant - Amir Mohamed; IT Director — Eugene Lao and playground supervisors — Dick Belshay, Joe Nikolao and JD Evans. The parish continues to support our school with a significant annual subsidy of approximately \$180,000.



PARISH LIFE

The total of registered households in the parish is 1,065. We welcomed 92 newly registered households. Some of the special events celebrated during the year included the Parish Picnic, the REACH Auction, and the 4US (ultrasound) Rally at Ft. Steilacoom Park. The Youth Group participated in the "Ignite Your Torch" youth conference at St. Martin's University, Lacey, and in The300 for 4US. Their fellowship, prayer and fun continued throughout the year. The CCS Family Housing Network group was hosted three times during the year. StrengthsFinder programs continued to help increase the engagement level of parishioners in parish life. The year ended with Father Seamus' retirement, with our blessings and best wishes.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Our parish St. Vincent de Paul volunteers continue to help needy people within our parish boundaries with vouchers for food, utilities, gas, and bus tickets. They responded to 278 requests for assistance, a 45% increase over last year. The monthly donations from parishioners, after the Masses, totaled \$25,785, a 7% decrease over last year.
