The Holy Spirit at work

Father Libardo noted three significant happenings that occurred in conjunction with the Feast of Saint Wenceslaus, which is celebrated on September 28.

- Saint Wenceslaus was selected out of 54 parishes to celebrate the Jubilee Year of Mercy that Pope Francis has called for. December 13, 2016 the Episcopal Vicar (Bishop) will solemnly open the door of the parish with a celebration of a special rite so parishioners from parishes in the Archdiocese can pilgrimage to Saint Wenceslaus to celebrate the Jubilee of Mercy and gain a plenary indulgence during until November 2016.
- The Archdiocese in Bogota celebrated true moments of grace with the consecration of 100 Eucharistic ministers, 38 of who were from Saint Wenceslaus parish, the sacrament of Confirmation of 78 young people and first Communion of 50 children.
- One hundred fifty three young children were consecrated as child missionaries to their families, their peers, their schoolmates and their communities on October 18, 2015. In the last five years Saint Wenceslaus trained 400 youngsters in this remarkable ministry called "Infancia Misionera", the pride of Saint Wenceslaus Parish.
