

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Responsorial Psalm for this Second Sunday of Lent is my favorite Psalm. Psalm 27 reads in part: "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is my life's refuge; of whom should I be afraid?"

It's a wonderful Psalm to have as we consider Saint Luke's narrative of the Lord's transfiguration on Mount Tabor. On that day, the Lord Jesus was arrayed in light; his face and clothing became dazzling white. The Lord appeared to Peter, James and John, in the fullness of his light and glory as he was preparing them to witness the darkest days of his passion: his arrest, trial, torture, suffering, and death on the cross. In the darkest of those days that would lie ahead, it is then that they needed the reminder of the light and glory of their master who was the Christ; the anointed savior of the world!

We too need to be reminded that the Lord is our light and salvation. When the dark days come upon us and try to convince us that we are nothing in the eyes of God, we are called to remember that the Lord Jesus is arrayed in dazzling light. He is the light of the world that dispels whatever darkness might be about us!

This coming Thursday, I will be at St. Joseph Parish in Chehalis giving the homily at the funeral of one of our senior priests, Fr. John McLaughlin. He was the retired pastor there and he helped out on a weekly basis. It was great to serve with him. Fr. John served as a simple, humble priest for over 58 years. Please pray for the repose of his soul and for the wellbeing of his very large family who will miss his smile and joyful presence!

MEATLESS RECIPE FOR SECOND WEEK OF LENT - CAPONATA WITH LENTILS IN WARM PITA

1 zucchini bite ½ red pepper and 4 garlic cloves You 2 celery stalks alu 1 tablespoon olive oil Lay 1 can no-salt res diced tomatoes me 2 teaspoons dried In a oregano me ½ cup green lentils Stir 2 teaspoons capers Trag 2 teaspoons balsamic veg vinegar Brin 4 whole wheat pitas lem Verture whole Verture Verture Verture vinegar 4 whole wheat pitas lem	ash all the veggies. Remove the tough ends and stems from the eggplant and zucchini. Chop each into e-sized chunks. Remove the stem and seeds from the red pepper and chop into bite-sized chunks. Peel d roughly chop the garlic. Dice the celery stalks. u will need 3 cooking dishes for this recipe: 1 baking dish that can be covered with a lid or minum foil, 1 large frying pan or cast-iron skillet, and 1 soup pot with a cover. y the eggplant, zucchini and red pepper pieces on a baking dish or pan. Choose a pan that can hold the to of the veggies later, and can be covered with a top or aluminum foil. Line the pan with olive oil or parch- ent paper to prevent sticking. Broil the vegetables for 5 minutes or until lightly browned. a large skillet with a little bit of olive oil or water, sauté the diced celery stalks for about 5 minutes over edium heat. Add the garlic, canned diced tomatoes, dried oregano and chili powder. r and heat for about 1 minute. Then, stir in the broiled eggplant, zucchini and red pepper. ansfer the veggie mixture to the back into baking dish with the parchment paper and bake the ggie mixture (covered) at 400°F. Ing water and green lentils to a boil in a pot with a lid. (Your water measurement should be 2.5 times the til measurement.) Once boiling, reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer for 20-30 minutes, or until water absorbed and green lentils have softened. Add more water if needed. er 10 minutes of the green lentils cooking, add capers or olives and balsamic vinegar to the veggie mix- e in the oven. Stir and return the pan to the oven. The veggies are done when they are soft throughout. then the green lentils and veggies are almost done, warm the pitas by wrapping them in aluminum foil and ting them in the oven. Season the green lentils and veggies with salt and pepper to taste. Add optional
	redients, like chili pepper flakes, now. Stuff the pita with the green lentils and veggies and enjoy!

REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter. (Code of Canon Law, 1249-1252)

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, are days of fast and abstinence.

Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all eighteen years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their sixtieth birthday.

On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all fourteen years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed.

Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.



WILL YOU BE AT LEAST 70 1/2 THIS YEAR?

When planning your IRA withdrawal strategy, you may want to consider making charitable donations through a qualified charitable distribution (QAD)

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year.

Also, QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to the recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction, but still use a QCD for charitable giving.
