

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel!

- Mark 1:15

Our Lenten theme of repentance and conversion of life is highlighted in this third week of Lent. Our Gospel reading equates our lives once again to that of a fig tree. Does our tree bear good, choice fruit or is it barren and dead? So too, our lives. Are they fruitful and life giving or are they dead and mired in sin?

This coming Thursday evening is our Lenten Reconciliation Service at Saint Patrick Parish, with a number of priests available to hear your confessions. It's in this sacrament of God's mercy that we encounter the person of Jesus, who receives our act of repentance as we confess our sins, so that we might open up our lives to the gifts of healing that are given by God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What are these gifts? The first gift is God's forgiveness of our sins. The second gift is the grace God freely gives to us so that we may amend our lives and be healed.

Most people readily accept the first gift of forgiveness. That's what we all want, right? That's why we come to confession in the first place. We want our sins taken away so that we can be restored in our relationship with God and each other. Most people, however, do not readily accept the second gift of God's grace. It's freely given, but like any gift, it must be accepted and used by the recipient. What is grace? Grace is a participation in the life of God. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC #1997). Simply put, grace is God's life and power that is made available to help us and heal us of all the underlying roots and sources that generate the sins we bring to confession. But grace is more than just a help given by God; it's actually a new kind of life that is made available to us – God's eternal life, poured into our soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify it." CCC 1999; see also 7 Secretes of Confession by Vinny Flynn, Chapter 2, pg.27.

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God's forgiveness of our sins initiates the process of healing in our lives. When His grace, given in the sacrament, is accepted by into our lives, God is at our side to heal us of the causes of our sins. The reason why so many of us repeat the same sins is that we haven't really used the grace given to us in this sacrament to bring about change and amendment of life. Once we do, however, you will see that God cannot be outdone in His generosity to heal, transform, and renew our lives.

Friends, use this season of Lent to bring the tree of your life to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Repent, confess your sins, and be forgiven. Then, with God's abundant grace, get to the heart of the matter and allow the Lord Jesus to bring you healing and renewal. You will bear much good fruit and will give glory to God's great love and mercy!



OUR COMMUNITY

At the beginning of the New Year, Father David used this mathematical image to share his reflections about his first six months as pastor of three parishes and a school. After much prayer and dialog with all three Pastoral Councils and staff at each parish, a vision for the way forward has emerged.

It is a vision of a greater sense of common purpose and unity among our three communities; a sense that we will be stronger disciples of Jesus as one unified community with three locations as opposed to three distinct communities with a common pastor. A major step in establishing this unified perception begins at the top, by establishing Unified Councils and Commissions with representatives from all parishes. Unified Councils we intend to establish include:

- Pastoral Council
- Finance Council (but maintain separate accounts)
- Liturgy Commission
- Faith Formation Commission
- Stewardship and Development Commission
- Pastoral Care Commission (new)
- Facilities Commission (new)

These Unified Councils and Commissions will serve as consultative bodies who will discern with the pastor and staff how best to address the challenges and opportunities we encounter as a unified faith community. Through deliberate pastoral planning and dialog they will make recommendations to the pastor regarding parish priorities, directions and policies and enhance communication and understanding among the various parish organizations and parishioners.

While these Unified Councils and Commissions are focused on the broader challenges and opportunities for our larger community, Parish Life Commissions (PLC) will be established at each parish. The three PLCs will help oversee the day to day ministries and programs at the parish level. It will be their responsibility, much like current Pastoral Councils, to (1) implement policies and procedures and decisions developed by the Joint Commissions and Councils, and (2) bring to their attention challenges and opportunities from the bottom up.

Membership for these councils and commissions will be determined this Spring through a process of discernment. It will not be an election. Parishioners interested in offering to serve on a Unified Council or Commission or Parish Life Commission are encouraged to contact the parish office. Stay tuned for additional information in the weeks ahead regarding:

- The talents and skills needed for these various councils and commissions
- The mechanics of the discernment process we will utilize to determine who will ultimately serve on various councils and commissions
- Schedule of key dates (please save the date of May 18th for discernment retreat)

MEATLESS RECIPE FOR THIRD WEEK OF LENT - TEX-MEX BOWL WITH AVACADO AND CHUNKY SALSA

1/4 avocado 1/4 cup brown rice 1/2 cup frozen corn 1 medium red pepper 1/2 cup green cabbage 2 1/2 cups kale

1/4 cup + 1 1/4 tbsp low-sodium salsa 1/4 can no-salt canned black beans

2 tbsp Pumpkin seeds

Cook the brown rice -

1 cup dry brown rice or basmati brown rice 2.5 cups water (= approx. 3 cups cooked)

Rinse the rice and add to a saucepan.

Add water and bring to a boil over medium-high heat.

Reduce heat to low, cover and simmer for 35-45 minutes or until tender, with most of the liquid absorbed. Let sit for five minutes, then fluff with a fork!

Rinse all the produce. Rip the kale leaves off by hand into small, bite-sized chunks. Dice the stems.

Steam the stems and the leaves for just a couple minutes, until lightly wilted.

Heat the corn until room temperature. Dice the red pepper and mix it in with the corn. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

Dice the green cabbage into small strips. Cut the avocado lengthwise around the pit. Twist to open. Cube the avocado.

Drain and rinse the beans.

Add the steamed kale to a serving bowl. Pile on the rice, beans, and veggies. Sprinkle pumpkin seeds and optional ingredients on top. Add salt and pepper to taste with a scoop of salsa. Enjoy!

REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter. (Code of Canon Law, 1249-1252)

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, are days of fast and abstinence.

Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all
eighteen years of age and older,
who have not yet celebrated their sixtieth birthday.

On a fast day one full meal is allowed.

Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength,
may be taken according to each one's needs,
but together they should not equal another full meal.

Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all fourteen years of age and older.

On days of abstinence no meat is allowed.

Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

ST. RITA CHAIRITY FUND MERGING WITH SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

For many years, Saint Rita has collected donations once a month for a Charity Fund that is used to provide financial support to persons in need residing in and around our parish community. The Saint Rita staff would receive requests from parishioners and non-parishioners alike, and provide limited financial assistance to those in need.

In April, responsibility for this program will shift to the local Saint Vincent de Paul Society that has been a long standing ministry of Saint Patrick Parish. The Saint Patrick site is the only remaining SVDP chapter serving north and central Tacoma. SVDP chapter volunteers meet with those in need from a variety of zip codes (including those covering Saint Rita boundaries) and also conduct home visits. Details of the services and assistance they provide can be found on the Saint Patrick website.

Saint Vincent de Paul, like the Saint Rita Charity Fund, is funded by donations from parishioners. In April, the current balance from the St Rita Charity Fund will be transferred to SVDP. Once a month collections will continue at both parishes. The Saint Rita Charity Fund buckets will be switched to SVDP buckets. Contributions from both parishes will be accounted for by SVDP and ultimately distributed to families in need from Saint Rita and Saint Patrick as well as non-parishioners from the greater Tacoma area. Combining our two programs under the one SVDP office will help us better serve a greater number of people in need.

One final note to bring to your attention. Operating an effective SVDP chapter requires a lot of volunteers who are willing to meet with those in need and sometimes make home visits. It is an incredibly rewarding ministry that helps us truly see the face of Jesus in the poor. Please consider volunteering your time to this most worthy ministry. 


