Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles this Sunday, we see the calling and results of the first universal Church council: the Council of Jerusalem. Many of us are familiar with the Second Vatican Council from the early 1960's, the fruit of which is still not fully received in 2019. The Council of Nicea gave us the creed. We look also to the Council of Trent, which was the Catholic response to the protestant reformation; it gave us liturgical renewal, a new catechism, reform of the clergy, and other fruits.

The question posed to the Council of Jerusalem was simple: In order to be a Christian, do you first need to become a Jew? As Paul and Barnabas were proclaiming the good news to the Gentiles, others, on their own, were telling the people that they first must follow the Mosaic practices, including circumcision, in order to be saved. Paul and Barnabas took this question to the Apostles, the elders, the bishops, and the "whole" Church, to receive counsel through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The council received that knowledge and proceeded to write a letter (the first council document!) stating that no burden of the Mosaic practices would be imposed upon the Gentiles. It was short, simple, and to the point!

What are the important theological lessons for us today from this early council? Well, for one, Christians don't first need to become Jews. But more importantly it tells us that our core identity is not found in religious or ethnic background. Our core identity is in Christ; that we are baptized into Christ and we are the Father's beloved sons and daughters. Notice how I addressed you at the beginning of this letter as "brothers and sisters in Christ." That my friends, is who we are. We are sons and daughters of a loving Father. That is our identity; nothing more and nothing less. Sadly, we live in a culture that has largely forgotten that. Society tells us our identity is defined by our gender, sexuality, ethnicity, race, hobbies, political or social ideology etc. But those things; those "labels" do not define us as human persons. As Christians, our identity and the fulfillment of that identity, rests in our relationship with God our Father. Our souls have been marked at our baptism. We are one with Him who created us and sustains us in His love. That is your dignity and your worth, and because of that you are priceless! Don't let others define you or tell you what you are or should be in accord with the popular belief of the day.

As Saint Catherine of Siena once said, "Be who you were created to be and you will set the world ablaze." It's time we Catholics set the world on fire! Know who you are as disciples of the Lord Jesus and live that truth each day!

STEPHEN MINISTRY SEEKS ADDITIONAL LEADERS



Stephen Ministry equips lay-people to provide one-to-one Christian care for those in our combined parishes, as well as the broader community, who are experiencing difficulties in their lives.

Dedicated leaders are vital to the sustainability of this program. In order to provide training to a new group of Stephen Ministers, while at the same time supervising those already in the field, we need to expand our leadership team. This should include at least one lady and one gentleman. Once our leadership team is in place, training will be offered for those desiring to become actual Stephen Ministers. It is an exciting time for individuals in our combined parishes to step forward as leaders in many new ways. Perhaps you are called to be a member of the Stephen Ministry Leadership Team. Here are some things to consider as you discern this calling: People learn to serve as Stephen Leaders by attending a Leader's Training Course. This is a required one-week conference that builds enthusiasm and introduces the resources you will need to train others.

There are still two Leader's Training Courses available this summer. Attending one of them will equip you for the church program-year beginning this September. These sessions generally include several hundred leaders-in-training from the US, Canada and various other countries.

The remaining sessions this year are: July 21 - 27 in Dallas, Texas Aug. 4 - 10 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania There will not be another session until January of 2020. For more information about these training sessions, go to Stephen Ministries LTC.

Other requirements for this leadership position include: Completing an application describing how this is a good match for your talents.

Providing two credible references verifying your qualifications. Obtaining a clear background check. Interviewing with the present members of the Stephen Leadership Team. Making a minimum 2-year commitment to working in this volunteer capacity.

The first step is to pick up an application form in your parish office. Once it is complete, please return it to your parish secretary. Interviews will take place during the third week in June. There are certainly qualified candidates in all three of our parishes.

May the Holy Spirit surround the discernment process as you consider this, and other leadership opportunities, currently available.

Celebrating Children at St. Patrick, Holy Cross and St. Rita


To the parents of our young children, may we suggest...

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children; Don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house. All are welcome!
- Do prepare your child ahead of time by modeling joy at the opportunity to worship God in this community.
- Sit toward the front where it is easier to see and hear.
- Quietly explain the parts of the Mass.
- Sing the hymns loudly, pray, and voice the responses with enthusiasm. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.
- If your child becomes particulary disruptive, feel free to leave Mass, but please come back. As Jesus said: "Let the children come to me."
- Trust the evironment of the Mass and our community to form your child over time.
- Please do not bring food or drink into the church unless they are medically indicated. Please do not bring electronic Games into Church. Please do not use the pew envelopes or other materials for artwork.

To the members of the parish...

- Remember that the way we welcome children in Church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God and to one another. Let them know that they are loved and appreciated in this house of worship.
- A smile of encouragement is always welcome to parents with small, active children.

The presence of children is a gift to the church, they give us "A future full of hope".

GLAD YOU ASKED! FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS REGARDING THE HOLY CROSS ROOF REPAIR

Q: When did the leaks start in this building?

<u>Answer:</u> The leaks in the north storage room roof and wall have been on and off for many years. Many repairs have taken place near the brick wall and it was very wet in the winter of 2017. The leak in the kitchen ceiling was serious during the winter of 2017. The leak in the storage room east of the kitchen was on and off in the winter of 2017.

Q: What was the process and what communication happened to assure best practices to repair the issues?

Answer: The Pastoral Council and Finance Council were alerted during the Winter of 2017. The Archdiocese of Seattle Property Management group was informed at that time and gave guidance to Deacon Jim Fish. It was required to have drawings and specifications for contractors bidding the work. The Pastoral Council agreed to hire a design consultant to prepare drawings and specs. Three consultants were invited to provide proposals for the work and after a review/interview process, Nexus was hired (with consent from the Archdiocese Property Management Office). Nexus was hired on March 22, 2018 following a fee proposal agreement reviewed by the Pastoral Council. Nexus prepared a scoping report from moisture testing and presented the findings to Pastoral Council on May 2, 2018.

Q: Was there a fund-raising campaign for the roof repairs?

<u>Answer:</u> No, that was not possible in light of the Archdiocese Called to Serve as Christ Campaign coming in the near future. The Parish Council and Finance Council felt the problems were urgent in nature and recommended using Parish Reserve Funds.

Q: What happened during the leaking process of 2017.

<u>Answer:</u> The Parish hired Bosnick Roofing for approx. \$3,800 to place temporary & emergency patching over the known leak zones. This went on thru the winter and spring of 2017/2018.

Q: How much damage occurred on interior finishes?

<u>Answer:</u> The May 2018 report from Nexus identified interior sheetrock and paint damage in 3 zones. The wood doors on the north entry to the parish hall were stained from water intrusion.

Q: Why is the Construction work phased?

<u>Answer:</u> The roof area is in small manageable zones and allows smooth sequence of work without added costs and eliminates large exposed areas of roof insulation below the weather tight membrane.

Q: What is in the future phase?

Answer: The steep sloped shingles and replacement of the clerestory window units.

Q: What is the replacement roof product, why was it selected and what is the life expectancy?

<u>Answer:</u> The Archdiocese Property Management Group requires Modified Bitumen Products for low slope roofs. If well maintained, it may last approximately 45 years.

Q: How many contractor bids were received and were they competitive?

Answer: We had two bids in a loaded bid environment in which it is difficult to secure qualified bids in a strong economy. The Archdiocese Property Management Group assisted Holy Cross and Nexus with evaluating the bid results and selecting Hilger Construction.


