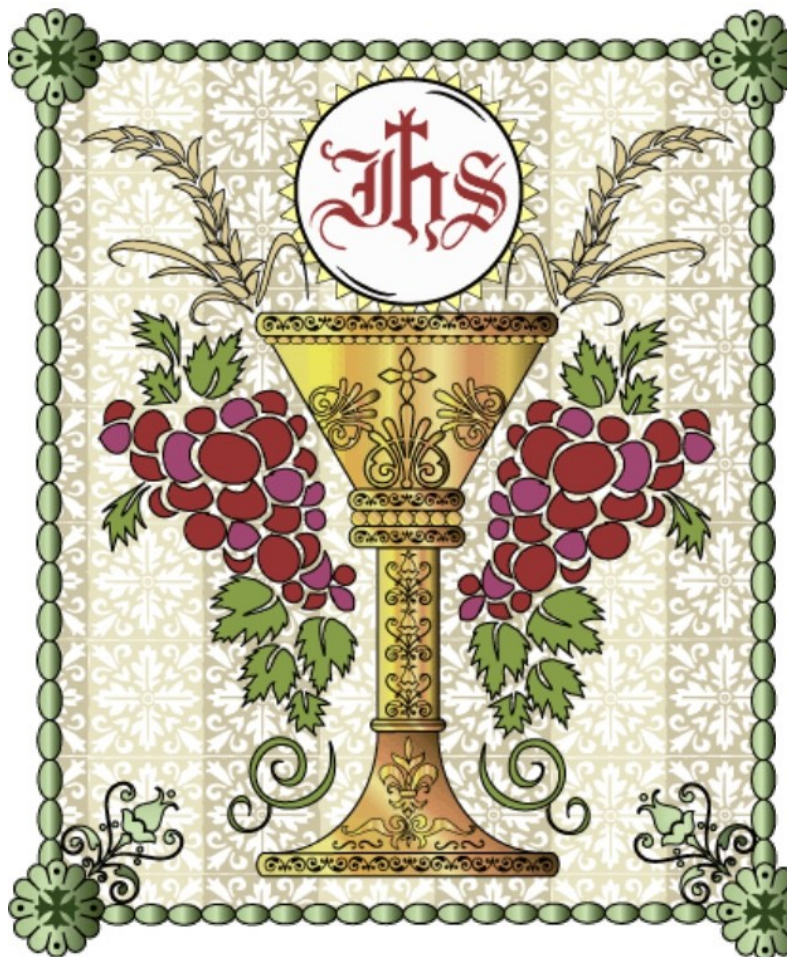

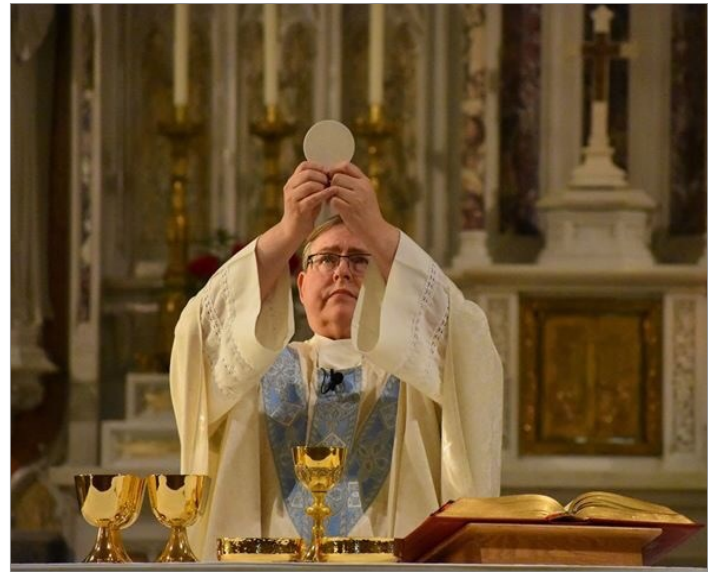

PASTOR'S LETTER

SUNDAY, JUNE 23, 2019



Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. We acknowledge the gift of the Holy Eucharist in our lives, in our Church, and to the world. Jesus promised in the Gospel that He would be with us until the end of the world. Of course, He is spiritually close to each of us every day. But He is also physically close to us when ordinary bread and wine become His real Body and Blood in the celebration of the Mass. The sacrifice of the Mass truly is making the loving sacrifice of the cross present to us; so much so that the Lord Jesus desires to be really there, on the altar, and then to be consumed by us in Holy Communion, so that He may be one with us and we may be one with Him. That is the gift of the Eucharist; being one with the body of Christ, both the head and the members!

None of this would be possible without the altar. For it is at the altar that the sacrifice of the cross is re-presented, and the altar is the place where the Body and Blood of the Lord becomes the source and wellspring of our lived Catholic faith. Archbishop Sartain inspired me once when he said that no matter where he is, he always feels at home when he reverences the altar with a kiss at the beginning of Mass. I too have taken on that same wonder! Whether it's the altar at Saint Patrick's, or Holy Cross, or Saint Rita's; or an altar in the woods or on a peak outside Cody, Wyoming (see above), every priest should feel at home in that place and at the time of the Mass. Every priest is ordained primarily to celebrate the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. We feel at home at every altar because it is there that the Lord has privileged us to be His instruments in making Him present in His Body and Blood. For it is from the altar that the Body and Blood of the Lord is received to renew God's love for us and our love for Him. Archbishop Fulton Sheen once said: "The greatest love story of all time is contained in a tiny white Host." Thanks be to God that we are part of that love story; renewed and refreshed by the Lord at every Mass!

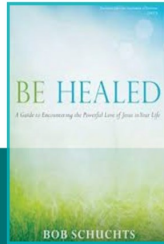

The Body and Blood of Christ

When Jesus went back to Heaven He didn't want to leave us all alone, so He gave Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. First He gave Himself to the Apostles at the Last Supper, and today He gives Himself to us in Holy Communion.

Normally when we eat something it gets absorbed into our body. But receiving Jesus in Holy Communion does something different. It makes us more into Jesus' Body! It brings our soul closer to God and closer to all the other people in the Church. That's what "Communion" means.

When we go to Communion in a state of grace we can get so much more grace from God. Our venial (small) sins can be taken away and we can get more strength to do His will. In fact, the time that your prayers are the most powerful is right after you receive Holy Communion, when Jesus is right inside you. He is your closest friend and only wants what is good for you. When you go to Communion remember Who you just received and don't forget to thank Him for coming to you!

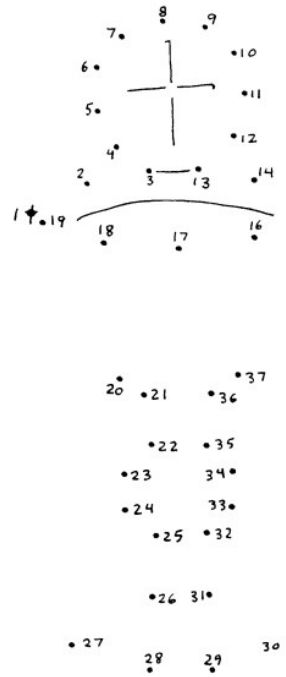

When He died on the cross He offered up His Body and Blood for us.

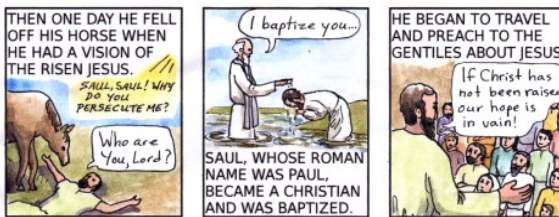

HAPPENING AT SAINT PATRICK

CYO ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

My name is Matt Smith and I have been the athletic director for St. Patrick Parish for the last 12 ½ years.

As my youngest child graduated from St. Patrick this spring, I retired from the Athletic Director position.

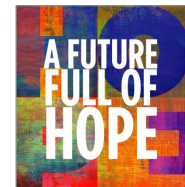

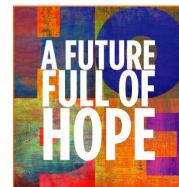

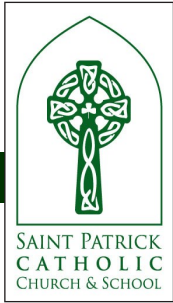

In his book, Visible Learning, researcher John Hattie explores what teaching strategies or school programs make a statistically significant difference in student learning.
His research suggests that while intentional academic summer work has only mild positive effects on student achievement, it does significantly reduce the academic slide that often occurs in the summer months.

In other words, researchers find that there is less time spent in the first month of school repeating old content in schools that have a structured summer learning program.

Our hope is that by engaging students in minimal but consistent summer reading and math, we will have them more ready to successfully begin school in September.

We want all of our students to excel, to be challenged, to feel success.

We want our kids to be kids and enjoy their summer vacation.

It is our hope that we found the right balance between rest and relaxation and keeping their minds alert.

We hope you climb real mountains this summer and encourage your children to use their summer to climb to even greater heights in reading and math.

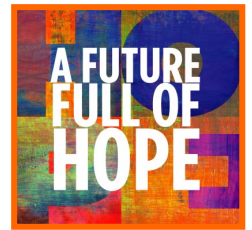

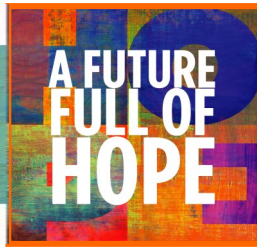

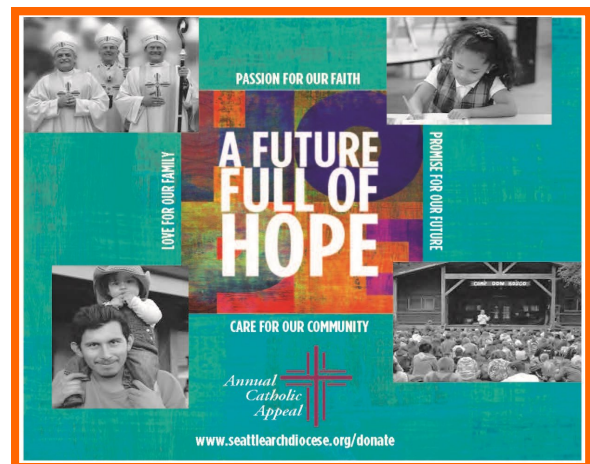
