

The Audacity of Holiness

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I have said many times, prayer is meant to be very simple; essentially an open conversation between us and the Father. Fr. Ian VanHeusen, a priest of the Diocese of Raleigh, North Carolina, has some bold words on the implications of such a relationship we call prayer:

"Through Jesus Christ, the Christian has the audacity to talk with God on familiar terms. In Christ, we have access to the Father as coheirs with the Son, and thus through grace we are given a certain equality with God. Such a radical claim does not mean that we cease to be humans, but rather that our humanity is brought into a whole new horizon of activity, a dramatic communion that bridges time and eternity.

The greatest failure of many Christians is that they fail to tap into the potential of this incredible gift. Instead of a spirit of confidence, many retreat into a lukewarm spirit, a petty spirit of mediocrity and sentimentality. Religion is not meant to simply be a warm blanket that soothes and calms the more difficult questions of our life, but an incredible journey of transformation, growth, and ultimately, sanctity.

To acknowledge the holiness of God's name is both an act of humility on God's part and an invitation to a spirit of boldness and prophecy. In Jesus Christ, God reveals his humility and comes to us in our lowly condition. Without God losing any of his omnipotence, he puts at our disposal the indwelling of his Holy Spirit and the vitality needed to live completely for him and for others. In turn, he calls us to use his name as an act of habitual remembrance, a weapon against lukewarmness and forgetfulness.

So often as we invoke God's name, we invite his presence into the midst of our lives. So often as we cry out from the depths of pain and suffering, we give him permission to enter into and transform our fallen human condition. It is this invitation which constitutes one of the essential features of prayer. Prayer is not so much a series of petitions or carefully considered pious reflections, but rather a simple surrender of faith, hope, and love. In this, we must dare to call on God by name. To speak with him in an exchange of intimacy and familiarity; an exchange of boldness and audacity."

May we all pray to our Father in a bold and audacious way! May we allow him to be our Father.



Every parishioner will be given an opportunity to make a gift in support of the campaign. Parishioners will be contacted by their fellow parishioners serving as campaign volunteers, as well as through direct mail, and a final, in-pew appeal at the end of our campaign. At each Mass, parishioners can expect to hear announcements regarding the progress of the campaign and read bulletin announcements offering details on the goals of the campaign.


HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?

Please prayerfully consider being a volunteer for the campaign as this effort is a major undertaking and your help would be appreciated. As a volunteer, you would serve as ambassador for Archbishop Sartain at your parish as he reaches out to more than 125,000 Catholic families across the Archdiocese. **To get involved, please contact your pastor or parish secretary.**

PRIESTS

Funds will be used to better meet our retirement obligations for current and future retired priests. The present payas-you-go model for the priest pension and medical plans was sustainable when there was a large number of active priests paying into the plan and a relatively small number receiving benefits. With the shortage of priests in active ministry, and a growing number of retired priests, the "pay-as-you-go" model will no longer be sustainable.

As a result, parishes are paying more and more into the plans through increased billings and the Annual Catholic Appeal each year. Through this campaign, the Archdiocese will eliminate the Annual Catholic Appeal's portion of funds designated to priest pension and senior priest medical expenses. Further, the Archdiocese plans to significantly reduce parish billings for the priest pension plan and eliminate the annual increases.



SISTERS


Women religious have played a crucial role in the history of our Church's mission in Western Washington. The positive impact and reach of their work cannot be overstated. They have answered the call to serve as Christ and for decades served with almost no compensation. This campaign will acknowledge and thank them for their sacrifice and ministry by splitting up the funds proportionately among the orders who have historically served our Archdiocese in order to assist them with their pension and medical needs.

PARISHES

Fifteen percent of the funds raised by parishes will be returned to them for specific needs such as reducing parish debt, completing capital improvements or growing parish endowments. After a parish reaches its set campaign goal, it will receive 85 percent of funds back.

COSTS

Six percent of the campaign funds will be marked for the costs of running the campaign. These costs include the design of all marketing material, printing, postage, professional assistance, grant writing, gift processing and events.

WHAT WILL OUR CAMPAIGN ACCOMPLISH?

The Archdiocese of Seattle initiated a \$100 million campaign to provide long-term funding for retirement and medical needs of priests and women religious, as well as support of individual parishes. After this campaign, the Archdiocese hopes to:

- Establish a stronger position to provide a consistent, modest retirement for priests by moving from a pay-as-you-go system to a fully-funded model for priest pension plan and medical benefit for retired priests.
- Increase the ability of women religious communities to care for their senior members while continuing their ministry to God's people.
- Provide parishes more resources for their local ministries, services, works and programs.
- Lead by example in prayer, action, and generosity.
- **Reinforce a dynamic faith** for the next generation of Catholics in Western Washington.




