

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this Sunday's Gospel from Saint Luke, we find these sobering words of our Lord: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."

Just what is the narrow gate that the Lord speaks of? Is it something we find at the culmination of our lives as we enter into eternal life? Or is it a constant gate that we are called to approach and enter at any number of times on a daily basis? It's probably both, but I would like to focus on the second image; that of the gate we may see any number of times on a daily basis.

The above painting uniquely depicts this verse of the Gospel. It sees the "narrow gate" as the cross itself, with a person literally climbing through the "opening" of the cross. Saint Paul famously said that he came to preach Christ crucified and risen. He did so knowing that the cross was the only way to the new life of resurrection. The cross of Christ, which Jesus said we too must take up daily and follow Him, is a key to striving toward the narrow gate in our own lives. Living daily with all our crosses recognizes that our pains and burdens can have a purpose beyond ourselves. And when our crosses are offered to the Lord, especially for something or someone worse off than us, they begin to have redemptive effect. Which in turn is what transforms our pains and burdens into happiness and joy. It may seem that accepting and "living" our crosses in this way is truly a narrow and even an archaic way to think. But we are called to think differently than the world. Jesus promises us that the "narrow" way and its gate leads to an infinite horizon of the fulfillment of all our desires. As Psalm 117 tells us in the responsorial, "For steadfast is his kindness toward us, and the fidelity of the Lord endures forever." May we place our trust in the Lord!



A Letter from Father David Mulholland

August 19, 2019

Dear Parishioners & Friends,

After months of intensive preparation, next week marks the official kickoff of the Called to Serve as Christ campaign at our parishes. In the coming weeks, every registered parish household will receive a letter and case statement from Archbishop Sartain. This packet will include a financial request and instructions on how you can invest in the retired priests and religious of the Archdiocese of Seattle and in our local parish projects.

In advance of the mailing, I want to express several thoughts regarding this campaign and what is being asked of our families:

Invitation, not Expectation - Every family will be asked to consider a specific commitment to the campaign. We have gone through an exhaustive process to determine requests that are appropriate for each family. That said, in some cases, the request may be too high. In some cases, it may be too low. The amount requested is not an expectation. It is an invitation – and the starting point for your personal discernment. Ultimately, the church is grateful for whatever gifts you can provide.

Reflect and Pray - In advance of the request, I ask that you spend some time reflecting on our church's rich past and those who sacrificed to bless us with the archdiocese and parish that we cherish today. Their future, and how you can help to ensure they remain strong for our children and families who will pray to and serve God after we are gone. Pray and ask the Lord for guidance. Give in a way that represents the blessings that you have received.

Shared Responsibility - One or even a few families cannot shoulder this campaign. It is our responsibility as one entire church community to ensure this effort is a success. That means generosity and sacrifice – and not just monetarily. We need gifts of time, talent and prayer too.

Join us as we kick off the Called to Serve as Christ Campaign at one of the following Masses. Mass will be followed by a short video presentation and refreshments* in the Church Hall.





ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT


to make up for your sin and learn a good lesson!


