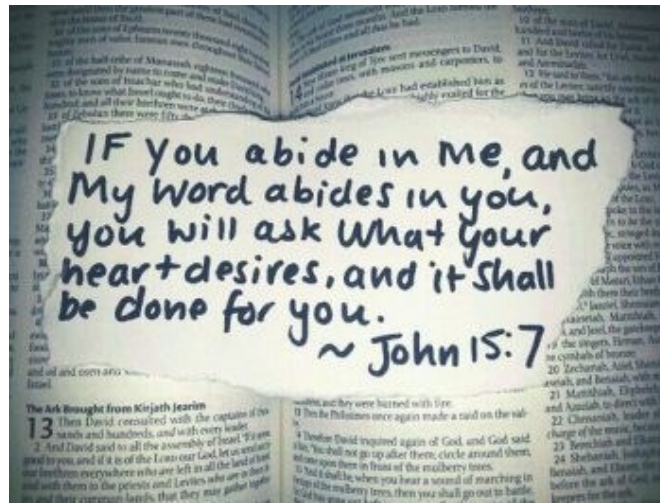

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken away from her.” - Luke 10:41-42

Our Sunday Gospel from Saint Luke is the story of the sisters Mary and Martha. Martha, the anxious doer of many domestic things, who in her anxiety about accomplishing burdensome tasks admonishes the Lord Jesus about her sister who is happy and content to sit at his feet and listen to him. How many of you, men and women alike, deem yourself a little (or a lot) like Martha or Mary? That’s not a bad thing. It’s what the Gospel is meant to do; to inspire us to take a look at our lives from God’s perspective and hopefully be inspired to adopt God’s perspective more often!

Today, we are called to adopt the perspective of the sister Mary. But what exactly is it? What is the “better part” that she has chosen as she sits at the feet of the Lord Jesus? I think the verse from John 15:7 in the above photo is a key to the “better part.” There, we are called to abide in the Lord Jesus by allowing his word to abide in us. It means more than trust, although trust has a role. It’s more than surrender, although surrendering to God has a role as well. To abide, in the spiritual sense, is to open your heart to the presence of the Lord at any given moment; to literally rest in him and with him. The image of Mary resting at the feet of Jesus, in complete peace and openness, is one of the most profound images of abiding in the Lord. It visually depicts the better part!

Abiding in the Lord is the fruit of contemplative prayer. Contemplation is a high form of prayer, but actually it’s quite simple. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 2565 says that “the life of prayer is the habit of being in the presence of the thrice-holy God and in communion with him...” To abide is to place your being into God’s loving presence and allowing your heart to be open and rest in His love. In such a place, it is then that he will guide you, protect you, calm you, reassure you, remove your Martha-like anxiety and fear, and allow you to experience the better part! I invite you to pray in this simple but powerful way. Allow the Lord to take you by your hand and in a place of silence, allow the Lord to speak to you...and rest in his Word!

CALLED TO SERVE *as* CHRIST

A campaign for our
PRIESTS, SISTERS & FAMILY OF FAITH

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST

In my first seven years as Archbishop of Seattle, I have had the privilege of celebrating 100th anniversaries of parishes and church buildings throughout western Washington in places large and small, and as diverse as the Church of the Visitation in Tacoma; St. Thomas in Tukwila; St. Catherine in Concrete; St. Yves in Harmony; and even the 150th Anniversary of St. Mary Star of the Sea in Port Townsend. These represent just a sample of the anniversaries occurring every year. Later this year, for example, I will celebrate the 150th Anniversary of St. John the Evangelist in Vancouver.

These joyful occasions provide an opportunity to reflect on our history and the work of God's grace. As I visit these parishes, I am always inspired by the stories of priests and religious who gave their lives to build up the faith here. Foremost among them was our first Bishop, A.M.A. Blanchet. As a canon of the Cathedral in Montreal, Quebec, Father Blanchet accepted the call to establish a diocese in a far-off place named Walla Walla. When circumstances prevented him from growing his diocese there, he moved to Vancouver in 1850. There Bishop Blanchet would establish his Cathedral, the seat of his newly-erected Diocese of Nesqually (later to become the Archdiocese

of Seattle). At that time, the Diocese of Nesqually encompassed all of what would become Washington State and even part of present-day Idaho.

Bishop Blanchet had a keen sense of history, and as he made the five-and-a-half-month overland trek from Montreal to the Oregon Territory in 1847, he kept a journal of his progress and, later, of his first years as bishop. The journal offers fascinating insights into our early days. One of my favorite entries is dated January 23, 1851:

The Blessed Sacrament is placed in the tabernacle for the first time since the foundation of the Mission at Vancouver. The tabernacle is lined only with white cotton while we wait to get some silk. The church, dedicated to St. James is then, at this moment truly, the House of God and the Gate of Heaven. We can say now: The Lord has sanctified this house which was built to establish His name here, and His eyes and His heart will always be there.

In fact, the first significant anniversary I had the privilege of celebrating as Archbishop of Seattle took place at the Proto-Cathedral of St. James in Vancouver on January 23, 2011 – the 160th Anniversary of the first time Bishop Blanchet reposed the Blessed Sacrament in that simple tabernacle.



Ever the pioneers, Bishop Blanchet, the priests and sisters who assisted him, Catholic explorers and many other dedicated laypersons accomplished incredible things in our early days. They also faced significant challenges: few resources, primitive transportation, disease, extreme weather, racism, and barriers of language and culture. I am deeply moved when I read the histories of hospitals, schools, orphanages, and monasteries established in western Washington. For the most part, these institutions were the apostolates of religious women and men who responded to God's call to serve the people of the area, beloved to the Lord no matter their religion, culture or language.

Quite simply, our forebears evangelized. They lived the life of Jesus Christ; they celebrated the sacraments; they taught the truth; they loved; they healed; they cared for the outcast; and most importantly, they prayed. The mission of the Church is to witness to Christ, to make him present and known in every possible way – especially through the Eucharist – and to form lives devoted to him.

Bishop Blanchet retired in 1879, praying that those who followed would "...have the pleasure [of] seeing mature the good seed which has been scattered in this garden of God during the past forty years." He died in February, 1887. In the 139 years since he wrote those words, the "garden of God" has indeed grown, matured, and born much fruit. It continues to do so today.

The Lord Jesus continues to call disciples to the Kingdom, and though we have means at our disposal that Bishop Blanchet could never have imagined, the spiritual and pastoral dynamic remains the same. The Church proclaims the Gospel ("evangelizes") to bring others to an authentic encounter with the Lord Jesus. In his grace and mercy, Jesus calls and sends disciples on his mission of mercy and love; and he himself provides lifelong formation and nourishment in the Church through word and sacrament. God's eyes and heart remain truly in our midst! From the day Bishop Blanchet reserved the Blessed Sacrament in his tabernacle to the day I am

writing these words, our mission has taken ever deeper root in this garden of God. At the same time, even after 168 years of archdiocesan history, as disciples of the Lord Jesus we must admit that we have only begun. God will do much more in his garden through us and long after we have gone home to him.

The *Called to Serve as Christ* campaign is an expression of our deep gratitude to those who have gone before us, especially our bishops, priests, and religious sisters, for the tireless ways they have lived out their vocations for the Lord and for us. As we look back in our history, however, we must also look forward and recognize the responsibility we have to generations yet to come. I believe that is exactly what Bishop Blanchet and our spiritual pioneers did. They knew that in tending the Lord's garden with love and enthusiasm they were also sowing seeds of the Gospel whose fruits future generations – we ourselves! – would enjoy. *Called to Serve as Christ* is an expression of thanks for the hundreds of senior priests and sisters still with us and for whom we have the responsibility to offer care and sustenance. It is also an expression of hope in the young clergy and sisters who do not yet see retirement on the horizon, and those who will come long after them. God is good and faithful to every generation.

I am excited and humbled to lead and contribute to the *Called to Serve as Christ* campaign, and I offer my encouragement to all of you to join me in this groundbreaking, historic endeavor. To be grateful for both our past and future is something we can do with certainty and hope – because God is good and faithful, because his Son Jesus will never cease to issue his call, and because the Holy Spirit will never cease to tend the Father's garden with love, holiness, and wisdom.

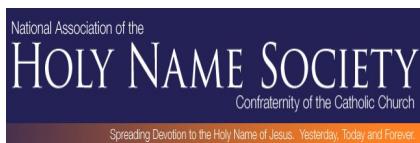

SUMMER CLIMB 2019

In his book, *Visible Learning*, researcher John Hattie explores what teaching strategies or school programs make a statistically significant difference in student learning.

His research suggests that while intentional academic summer work has only mild positive effects on student achievement, it does significantly reduce the academic slide that often occurs in the summer months.

In other words, researchers find that there is less time spent in the first month of school repeating old content in schools that have a structured summer learning program.

Our hope is that by engaging students in minimal but consistent summer reading and math, we will have them more ready to successfully begin school in September.

We want all of our students to excel, to be challenged, to feel success.

We want our kids to be kids and enjoy their summer vacation.

It is our hope that we found the right balance between rest and relaxation and keeping their minds alert.

We hope you climb real mountains this summer and encourage your children to use their summer to climb to even greater heights in reading and math.
