Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

While Saint Patrick and Saint Rita parishes will hear the beautiful Parable of the Prodigal Son from Saint Luke's Gospel this Sunday, Holy Cross Parish will be celebrating their feast day... the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast is celebrated on September 14th, but can be transferred to the nearest Sunday for a parish feast day. Yet, in many ways, the lessons of the prodigal son and the cross of Christ are the same.

"Behold the wood of the cross, on which hung the savior of the world" is the chant of the priest or deacon as the cross is brought into the church at the Good Friday Service during Holy Week. It is chanted three times. The response of the people follows three times: "Thanks be to God!" Truly, thanks be to God who gave us the Lord Jesus as a savior! Our loving Father gave us his son Jesus, to become one with us in all things but sin; who then suffered for us and freely took upon all the sin of all time, to nail it to the cross, so that death would be defeated and eternal life would once again become our destiny. This in essence, is the "kerygma," a Greek word meaning "proclamation." What is being proclaimed? The good news of Jesus Christ is being proclaimed. His gift of salvation; his defeat of sin and death; his victory that promises us transformation and healing.

If you want to go a little deeper to understand the kerygma and its relation to your life, then I would encourage you to sign up and attend the Alpha sessions beginning on Tuesday, September 17th at Holy Cross Parish. Alpha, which means beginning, is literally the beginning of the story of salvation offered to us by God our Father. I hope to see you there.

And what about the Parable of the Prodigal Son? Well, where the cross of Christ is a visual representation of the gift of salvation, the story of the prodigal son is a narrative of that salvation; a wayward son, prone to sin and death, is embraced by the merciful love of his father, and restored to his rightful place as a beloved son. The cross, in turn, upon which hung the very Son of God, was the place of the most loving and merciful "embrace" of the Lord Jesus....for us and our salvation. We, my friends, are prodigal sons and daughters of the Father, saved by Jesus' embrace on the cross!

There seems to be a lot of "Financial Asks" coming from the church lately. How are we expected to support all of them?

That's a great question. Yes, there have been multiple projects and campaigns in the parish and diocese that involve an "ask" for financial support. In our continued effort to be more up front and clear about the complete finances of our parish, we would like to provide the following line-up of all the major financial projects you can expect to see this coming year:

Local Populace

Special Collections (throughout the year)

It is a lot, and not everyone is capable of supporting all of them. But it is also indicative of being a vibrant parish that is actively involved in bringing Christ into the world, and that mission requires resources.

How and where you share your financial blessings is a very personal decision. But we do offer a few suggestions as to how you might consider discerning how you will prioritize the charities you support.

One recommendation is to consider setting aside 10% of your income for charity, with 5% donated to your church and 5% to other charities of choice. Within the gifts you direct to the church your first priority is to your parish (Sacrificial Giving and School Programs); your second priority is to the archdiocese (Annual Catholic Appeal, Catholic Community Services, etc); and third are special campaigns (Called to Serve as Christ, Building Renovations, Roofs, etc). These special campaigns call for support above and beyond the first two priorities, and it is not the intent of these campaigns for parishioners to interrupt their giving to the parish and archdiocese in order to give to special campaigns. Contributions to such campaigns are the result of extra giving above and beyond because of the importance of the campaign.

Charitable giving is indeed a complicated and very personal decision. These are just some broad recommendations we offer to help you in your discernment process. We hope to provide additional information in the coming weeks and months.

Archdiocese of Seattle PRIEST PENSION AND RETIREE MEDICAL PLAN FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW WERE THE CAMPAIGN GOALS FOR THE PRIESTS' PENSION AND MEDICAL PLANS ESTABLISHED?

Key assumptions and data supporting the goals for the priest pension and retired priest medical plan:

- 1. Number of retirees receiving benefits will be 110.
 - a. As of January 1, 2018, the Archdiocese had 111 Priests receiving benefits.
 - b. It is expected that that number will be stable at 110. The Archdiocese's actuaries determined this number based on our present census of priests and seminarians.
- 2. Funding objective is to provide adequate resources to pay benefits for existing and future retirees.
- 3. Pension benefit is \$1,943 per month, per priest.
- 4. Retired priest medical costs are \$800 per month, per priest.
- 5. The Archdiocese wishes to significantly reduce the billings to parishes and eliminate the portion of Annual Catholic Appeal goals which are annually earmarked for the pension and post-retirement medical costs. Annual amounts:
 - a. \$1.6 million in additional Annual Catholic Appeal goals.
 - b. \$950,000 (\$9,400 per parish) in additional parish billings. Additionally, absent a successful campaign, these billings will increase by \$600 per parish, per year for the foreseeable future.

Given the background described above, here are the computations for the priest pension and retired priest medical plan:

WHAT WERE THE HISTORICAL RETURN RATES FOR THE PENSION AND MEDICAL PLANS?

The following are the historical returns on the Priest's Pension and Medical Plan investments for periods ended December 31, 2017:

- The returns for each plan have performed well when compared to their investment policy benchmarks.
- Because of liquidity needs, 51 percent of the medical plan assets are allocated to short term and intermediate term bond fund which results in lower returns compared to the pension plan.

Archdiocese of Seattle PRIEST PENSION AND RETIREE MEDICAL PLAN FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHY RUN A CAMPAIGN FOR THE PRIEST PENSION AND RETIREE MEDICAL PLANS NOW?

The Archdiocese of Seattle's Priest Pension and Retiree Medical Plans operate on a pay-as-you-go basis. Funds collected from parishes are just enough to pay for the current pension benefits and medical expenses. Presently, the Archdiocese of Seattle bills parishes \$9,400 per assigned priest for pension plan expenses. The Annual Catholic Appeal goal includes an \$800,000 additional allocation to the priests' pension plan and another \$800,000 for medical costs of retired priests. Those funds, individual memorial contributions, and the annual second collection envelope in October roughly equal the payments needed for the current benefits and expenses of the plans.

To date, the amounts have been adequate to pay benefits but not to increase invested assets at the rate needed to provide the same level of support in the future. The Archdiocese of Seattle knows the increasing billing amounts and the Annual Catholic Appeal portion will become ever more burdensome to parishes if we maintain this pay-as-you-go approach. If nothing is done, parish billing amounts will continue to rise as:

- The cost of living increases
- Priests live longer
- The ratio of retirees to active priests increases
- Medical costs increase

For these reasons, Archbishop Sartain has accepted the recommendations of the archdiocesan consultative groups to provide capital to both plans through a major campaign as the best course of action to address future needs. A successful campaign will result in significantly reduced billings to parishes for the priest pension and retiree medical benefit plans.

Through a successful campaign:

- Annual Catholic Appeal allocations of \$800,000 per year to the priest pension plan and \$800,000 to the priest retirement medical plan will be eliminated a total of \$1.6 million in savings.
- Annual billings to parishes of \$9,400, per active priest, to the pension plan will be significantly reduced. These annual billings total approximately \$950,000.

or many people, a speeding ticket usually means a bit of embarrassment, a fine, or the inconvenience of appearing in court. But for those living in poverty, a speeding ticket can become a life-altering event.

In New Orleans, Donald lost his license years ago because he was caught speeding, could not pay the fine, and could not take off work to go to court. Contempt of court citations and unlicensed driving tickets quickly compounded the initial fine. Donald was losing hope that he could clear the backlog, get a better-paying job, and support his growing family while living right above the poverty level.


Thanks to your generosity to CCHD, the New Orleans Workers Center for Racial Justice (NOWCRJ) was able to provide Donald with the support he needed to change his situation. NOWCRJ hosted a clinic where Donald set up payment plans for his fines and got his license reinstated. Now Donald has a new job and has

been able to save money to move into his own apartment. NOWCRJ is also working with the judicial system to reduce backlogs, expunge records, and change how penalties are issued. With your contributions, our brothers and sisters across the country are breaking out of the cycle of poverty.



Be it known to all who enter here that Christ is the reason for this school. He is the unseen but ever-present teacher in the classroom. He is the model of its faculty and the inspiration of its students.

WHAT DO YOU SEE?

Dear families.

This past Friday, we had our first assembly officially welcoming everyone to the 2019-20 school year. Teachers were all wearing our Annual Fund theme t-shirts; 2020 Community Vision. I was sporting my sunglasses as well which gave me (besides a rather cool look?) the opportunity to look all around without kids thinking I was looking at them

At the end of our first week, this is what I saw. Kids walking into the gym hand in hand, oldest stretching down their arms to reach the littlest. Some were carried; a Kindergartner on the shoulders of our tallest 8th grader until a teacher yelled. "Get him down!" Some buddies met in the gym for the first time, quietly finding a comfortable place to introduce themselves. I saw teachers guiding but letting the natural flow of companionship begin.

I saw ASB officers ready to take charge, to name their leadership as one of service, united together. I saw students stand for our National Anthem, hands over their hearts. I recognized the normal glances of younger students peeking at their older buddies for direction, and then mimicking their actions as they signed themselves with the cross as we began with prayer.

Once we began with games, it was clear that teachers don't mind being vulnerable, and they like to win. A couple wore old stockings on their heads swinging a ball like an elephant swinging their trunks to the amusement of our students. It was fun to see easy interactions between kids and adults as the winning teachers received high five congratulations and the losing teacher mocked disappointment to the encouraging words, "Nice try, Mr. Norton."

The last game of the assembly was a vivid reminder of the theme of our Annual Fund as teachers were blind-folded before navigating an obstacle course. A student had to direct the teachers through the course. It was interesting and encouraging to see the great care that each student took in helping the teacher side-step cones, walk over ropes, and kept from stumbling. As the game finished without injury, Jack, our ASB President exclaimed, "Even students can be teachers." Jack saw what many of us hope happens everyday; that we are a community with a vision that everyone matters, and we all need each other to learn, to be better, to grow.

The back of our Annual Fund t-shirt asks the question: What Do You See? I hope you see a school full of joy and hope. It is what I look for as we begin our first full week.
