The Atrium - A Place of Peace for All

Every Fall since 1997, children and a few adults have gathered weekly in prayer and worship. We have prayed, sung, learned about scripture and liturgy, and have grown as small faith communities. We have listened to the words of the Prophets, prayed with the Psalms, and have drawn especially close to the words of Jesus. Together, we are being formed into intentional discipleship. I am writing, of course, about the experience in the atrium, a sacred space for children ages 3-12, and adults who commit to journey alongside them. In this place, the values of contemplation and enjoyment of God's great love predominate. This 'program' or process is called the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. For children, contemplation and enjoyment are woven into the fabric of their DNA. We, the adults, are privileged to learn from their innate ability to dive deeply into the metaphysical world of faith. See https://www.cgsusa.org

This past week, a group of 6-9 year old children were leading prayer. The children come from all types of schooling and all academic and physical ability levels. We are continually delighted to discover that the environment is uniquely qualified to serve children with special needs. Indeed, the experience of encounter with the sacred is not limited to 'typically developing children'. All are welcome. This week's prayer with this particular group was beautiful, as it always is. This session has a child with Autism spectrum disorder. The catechists and children take special care to make sure he feels included and is able to find a portal into the scriptures that speak to him. He is content in this space. The community embraces him for being the beautiful child of God that he is. We learn and grow from each other.

Since the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd has been at St. Patrick for 22 years, we have seen countless children grow up in the faith. We are honored to keep in touch with some of these children and delighted to see how the 9 year journey through parables, liturgical celebrations, study, and personal prayer has borne fruit. Recently, I learned what some of our 'ex bambini' (as they are called) are up to. Here is but a small example: Going on retreat at the Newman Center at his college, assisting in the leadership in Youth Ministry, choosing marriage vocations, pursuing public service and medical professions, working in ministry, becoming teachers.... The list goes on.

How hopeful it is to consider that the formation of the atrium aided these young people to bring Christ to our wounded world, and to live in the fullness of Jesus' Light with hope and joy, knowing that the Good Shepherd calls them by name for a unique purpose in the Kingdom of God.

GLAD YOU ASKED THAT

THERE SEEMS TO BE A LOT OF "FINANCIAL ASKS" COMING FROM THE CHURCH LATELY. HOW ARE WE EXPECTED TO SUPPORT ALL OF THEM?

That is a great question. Yes, there have been multiple projects and campaigns in the parish and diocese that involve an "ask" for financial support. In our continued effort to be more up front and clear about the complete finances of our parish, we would like to provide the following line-up of all the major financial projects you can expect to see this coming year:

It is a lot, and we realize not everyone is capable of supporting all of them. But this is also indicative of being a vibrant parish community that is actively involved in our Mission to bring Christ into the world, that Mission requires resources.

How and where you share your financial blessings is a very personal decision. But we do offer a few suggestions as to how you might consider discerning how you will prioritize the charities you support.

One recommendation is to consider setting aside 10% of your income for charity, with 5% donated to your church and 5% to other charities of choice. For the gifts you direct to the church the established first priority is to your parish (Sacrificial Giving and School Programs); your second priority is to the greater archdiocese (Annual Catholic Appeal, Catholic Community Services, etc); and third in priority are special campaigns (Called to Serve as Christ, Building Renovations, Roofs, etc). The special campaigns call for support above and beyond the first two priorities, and it is not the intent of these campaigns for parishioners to interrupt or reduce their giving to the parish in order to give to special campaigns. It is the intent that contributions to such unique campaigns are the result of extra giving above and beyond regular support to the parish.

Charitable giving is indeed a complicated and very personal decision. We offer these broad recommendations in hopes that they help you in your discernment process during the Stewardship of Treasure campaign now in effect.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

"Some Saducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus ..." In this Sunday's Gospel, the Saducees avoid their real question. Is there a resurrection from the dead or not? Rather than ask this question point blank, the Saducees try to prove their point through a roundabout, unrealistic scenario. Jesus cuts straight to the question behind the question, citing Scripture passages relating to the resurrection.

The Saducees are trying to trick Jesus. While we may not intend to stump God, our doubts and questions may have more in common with the Saducees than we care to admit. Doubts are part and parcel of life in a fallen world. Still, there are different ways we can word our doubts to ourselves, God, and others. When we're struggling, truly struggling, about some article of faith, do we admit it? Or do we cloak it with other, obtuse questions to hide the nature of our concern?

Have you considered leaving the Church over the hypocrisy of some of her members and leaders? Perhaps the real question is: "How can a place blessed by God and instituted by Christ have this evil in it? Can I reconcile with the concept that an institution has an admixture of good and bad? What do I expect from others, from myself? What responsibility do I have to try and remedy evil in an institution I'm part of?" Perhaps you've wondered about the nature of romantic love, and if God is love, does He really care so much about the details of this particular scenario? Perhaps the real question is: "Can my mind wrap around the concept of a God whose law seems - on the surface, in this situation - to make people unhappy? What is the relationship between the moral law and human flourishing?" These aren't easy questions, but they are more honest ones. This week, don't be afraid of your deeper questions! Bring them to God, to someone you trust, and to yourself.




