In the town of Barrow, located in Alaska, The suns sets on November 18<sup>TH</sup> and rises on January 23<sup>RD</sup>. Between this period there is total darkness for 67 days.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As most of you know, I lived in Alaska, practicing law, for three years in the early 1990's. It was a great adventure, in so many ways. But I was happy to return home as well. In 1992, I had the opportunity (or more like an obligation!) to travel north to Barrow, Alaska in the dead of winter to take the testimony of an oil worker who was a witness in a very serious injury case that I was working on. It wasn't an easy trip. It was cold; it was windy; it was dark; it was not pleasant at all. As the above picture notes, this coming Monday begins Barrow's descent into total darkness for 67 days. And the time before and after is pretty dark as well. My experience of the cold and dark in the day and a half I spent there, can best be described as oppressive and almost alien.

Reflecting on my Barrow trip years later, it reminded me that we truly are a people of light. Jesus said that he is the light of the world. In our reading from the Prophet Malachi this Sunday, despite the prediction of darkness and calamity at the end of the days, "But for you who fear my name, [says the Lord] there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays."

Even amid the darkness of winter, the promise of future light remains. Amid every trial and turmoil, is the promise of a new day. During that dark time in Barrow, after our long and contentious deposition was over, I, along with the opposing counsel, the witness, the clients, and the court reporter; we all feasted on a delicious salmon dinner together. Native Alaskans came and preformed a beautiful dance for us. All differences and legal arguments were put aside for a moment, and I would say that the light of Christ shined on us in the dead of the Barrow winter for a wonderful evening. We literally saw each other in a "new light" as we all had such a good time in the dark and cold of Barrow. Many years later, it reminded me that true fellowship was always possible regardless of the situation. I believe those "healing rays" that night helped us all to resolve that difficult case in a good way. It was an unforgettable trip, and very necessary in many ways. And it's a good lesson that sometimes we must appreciate the darkness before we can receive and appreciate the blessing of the light!



Each week our new Three Parish Stewardship report will provide separate monthly reports on (1) contributions received, (2) expenses paid, (3) Mass attendance, and (4) various trend reports to help provide greater openness and understanding of how our three parishes operate, and intend to grow in our Mission.

These early deficits are not unexpected.

As stated in our 2019-20 Budget Explanation, our projected expenses (Amount Needed to Fulfill Mission) exceed last year's Sacrificial Giving by \$78,391.

It is a calculated risk by our parishes to commit to these increased Mission related expenses (mostly personnel costs) before our parishes have actually contributed the funds we need.

We are relying on our parishioners to respond to the recent presentations from the Finance Council regarding the greater call to Stewardship.

Shifting from Maintenance to Mission requires more financial resources.

Our strategy to increase giving is threefold:

(1) greater explanation of how our parish operates:

(2) encouraging parishioners who have not been giving regularly to consider starting to give consistently; and (3) asking those who are currently giving, to consider giving more, if possible, to support this greater Mission we have entered upon.





#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

Where would you go if the world was ending? What would you do? The last decade has seen a rise in doomsday prepping, the marketing of survival techniques, and a sea of products designed for you to weather the apocalypse. "The days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another that will not be thrown down," Jesus warns in today's Gospel. On the one hand, he is referring to the literal downfall of the city of Jerusalem, Indeed. many of his prophecies here have come true over the last few millennium. Nations have indeed "rise[n] against nation[s]," kingdoms against kingdoms. Surf any world news website today alone, and you will see stories of "powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues." Jesus' advice to his disciples, however, isn't to build a bunker. It's to persevere in faith ... which won't be

"They will seize and persecute you ... you will be handed over ... you will be hated because of my name." This warning, too, has come to pass in the Church throughout history in state-sponsored persecutions and martyrdoms. Jesus is the Messiah, but his first coming was not a coming of earthly victory. Any disciple of his can expect a challenge. The coming of Christ didn't disrupt our free will. Evil still exists and sometimes even appears to triumph. This does not mean God has abandoned His people!

Jesus reminds the disciples - and us - of his constant presence. "I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking." In other Gospel passages, Jesus promises and sends the Holy Spirit upon his followers. The presence of God is real in our lives, no matter what trials come our way. It's tempting to be distracted or dismayed by natural destruction and moral evil in the world. But the Church has weathered greater storms. The sacredness of the human person endures. We can have hope! This day and every day, we can persevere in hope and trust in God.
