#### Dear Parishioners,

When we think of Christ the King, our first thoughts might be somewhat troubling. We know from human history that kings and queens aren't the noblest of people. Their rule is often one of oppression and suffering, while they themselves grow rich. So, with Jesus, how is his "kingship" different?

Christ's kingship is different in that he calls us to share in his rule; in his dominion over the world. When we are baptized, we become partakers in his identity as priest, prophet, and king. For children, this happens right after their baptism in the form of the anointing with the sacred chrism oil. As his disciples, we are called to exercise our common priesthood by offering the sacrifice of our lives; we are called to proclaim the good news of his salvation to all we encounter; and we are called to exercise his dominion by loving God and our neighbor. Pope Benedict VI wrote beautifully about Christ's kingship, based on love and truth, in a 2006 Angelus Address:

"The whole of his life reveals that God is love: so this is the truth to which he witnessed to the full with the sacrifice of his own life on Calvary. The Cross is the "throne" where he manifested his sublime kingship as God Love: by offering himself in expiation for the sin of the world, he defeated the "ruler of this world" (Jn 12: 31) and established the Kingdom of God once and for all. It is a Kingdom that will be fully revealed at the end of time, after the destruction of every enemy and last of all, death (cf. I Cor 15: 25-26). The Son will then deliver the Kingdom to the Father and God will finally be "everything to everyone" (I Cor 15: 28).

The way to reach this goal is long and admits of no short cuts: indeed, every person must freely accept the truth of God's love. He is Love and Truth, and neither Love nor Truth are ever imposed: they come knocking at the doors of the heart and the mind and where they can enter they bring peace and joy. This is how God reigns; this is his project of salvation, a "mystery" in the biblical sense of the word: a plan that is gradually revealed in history."

Friends, the "mystery" of Christ's universal kingdom is constantly being revealed in the story of our lives. We truly have an important part to play as the fruit of our lives bears witness to his love...a love that makes his kingship one of beauty, grace, compassion, and care. Truly, other worldly!



#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

"The rulers sneered ... the soldiers jeered ... one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus." Is this the King of the Jews, the King of the Universe? If it is so, perhaps his kingdom is not at all what we would expect! In his letter to the laity, St. John Paul II spoke about how Christians share in the kingly mission of Christ. First, "they exercise their kingship as Christians, above all in the spiritual combat in which they seek to overcome in themselves the kingdom of sin." In other words, before we give any thought to transforming society, we must first allow God to transform us. Through daily prayer, regular self-examination, and frequent confession, we can recognize our faults more readily and choose love instead!

Second, St. John Paul II writes that the laity "make[s] a gift of themselves so as to serve, in justice and in charity, Jesus who is himself present in all his brothers and sisters, above all in the very least." Christ's kingship, and our own participation in it, is requires us to look beyond the privileged of society. It goes beyond networking and struggles of power. It goes with Jesus to the Cross!

Still, the kingship of Christ ought to effect society. "The lay faithful are called to restore to creation all its original value ... ordering creation to the authentic wellbeing of humanity." Jesus does this in a radical way through his death and resurrection. We, too, are invited to bring new life to the world around us. This means holding the world and everything in it as sacred. It means advocating for civil policies that respect life and paying special care to the vulnerable and marginalized in every stage of life. It means being disciples of Jesus, inviting people into authentic love so that one day we will together "be with [him] in Paradise!"


