

Dear Friends in Christ,

Lent is upon us! You will notice from the bulletin cover and the photo above, two scenes from the Stations of the Cross. I am not the biggest fan of contemporary /modern religious art. I find that the beauty of faith in God does not lend itself well to the abstract. But that's just me. However, I feel that it works well in depicting the stations of the cross, particularly the idea of movement. The Stations of the Cross depict the Way of the Cross; the journey the Lord Jesus made from his arrest and trial to his placement in the tomb after his crucifixion. Each stop or station along the way, has religious meaning and significance. I hope to draw upon some of that in my Lenten homilies this year.

Like the Way of the Cross, Lent is itself a journey; a journey marking the time from Ash Wednesday to Holy Week, as well as a spiritual journey of faith, meaning, conversion, and hopefully personal growth. We begin with the powerful symbol of ashes on our foreheads, taking to heart the words, repent and believe in the gospel. On this First Sunday of Lent, the above art from the "Sinners Stations," depicts Jesus beginning his journey by embracing the cross. For him, this really began three years before, when after his baptism he was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by Satan. Can we relate to that? Many of the crosses we bear are placed upon our shoulders by Satan himself. Other are of our own making. Still others are heaped upon us by those around us. Lent is our own journey in the desert, where we can, with the Lord's help, see ourselves as we truly are, and with God's insight and grace, move forward from the cross to the resurrection.

May this season of Lent be one that truly opens your eyes to the journey from sin to healing in Christ. May the crosses we bear give way to the grace of rest in the embrace of the Lord. Let us keep each other in prayer during our journey to the joy of Easter!

LENT IN THE ATRIUM

At the beginning of Lent we 'bury' the Alleluia (decorated papers with the word "Alleluia" made by the children). We change our prayer corner cloth to Violet, the color the Church uses to represent this waiting time of Lent. We pray with the parable of the Good Shepherd, remembering that we are called by name and loved by God. We help children learn about the location of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection by showing the City of Jerusalem. We celebrate the Last Supper by reenacting it and hearing, once again, the words of love that Jesus gave us at this meal.

"Take, and eat, this is my body, broken for you. Take and drink, this is my blood poured out for you. Do this in memory of me."

The children are so filled with joy and peace when they are in the atrium. We are grateful for the ongoing support of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Life can easily spin us out of control. While there are so many wonderful opportunities before us, we can also get easily distracted and exhausted. There is always something to do, respond to, or check. The clutter of our lives can take us off course, and the best remedy for getting back on track is the experience of the desert. Here we can face our demons square on, resist them, and get back on course. We desperately need the season of Lent. This simple time of year forces us into greater awareness and grounds us in what is good and true.

What weighs you down and keeps you trapped? Maybe you are trying to do too much and please too many people. It could be that your fragile self-image is always pushing you to prove yourself and find success. Anxiety and worry, ultimately due to a lack of faith, can quickly tempt you with despair. It could be that you are listening to too many voices and allowing all of the negativity that is present erode the genuine goodness in your heart and in all of God's creation. Or maybe you struggle too much with fear. Perhaps so much so that you are far too preoccupied with your own agenda and goals and left with little psychological or spiritual room to consider and respond to the plight of your neighbor. Do anger, bitterness, stubbornness, and hatred have homes in your heart? How about greed, gluttony, pride, apathy, or lust?

For many, their passions and what can be found on the internet are their downfall, and they are robbed of their inner life and freedom. What is it, specifically, that tempts you away from a childlike trust in God? Define this and use the next few weeks to allow God to chart you a course away from them. Silence, being alone, grace, honesty, struggle, tears, and dryness are all found in the desert. You will also find God and your true self in this holy place. Ready to go?




As a community, we have heard throughout the fall and winter of Father David Mulholland's vision to move our parishes from Maintenance to Mission. Knowing full well the 2019-2020 expenses needed to move us in the Missionoriented direction would be \$78,391 more than our income from the previous year. Our Finance Council initiated a very intentional strategy to generate this additional revenue from our parishes.

The three-fold strategy included: (1) presenting more detailed and realistic information about parish programs and their true costs; (2) encouraging parishioners who have not given consistently in the past to begin doing so now; and (3) asking households currently giving regularly to consider giving more, if possible.

It was a calculated risk on our part to commit to these additional Mission-oriented expenses but we were confident in the response we would see from our parishes.

We're grateful to report back to you some very positive news regarding your willingness to financially support your parishes!

- Actual giving from July 2019 December 2019 compared to July 2019 December 2018 increased by **\$48,247**
- 142 New Pledges received
- 178 Parishioners increased their pledge amount
- Total dollars pledged increased from **\$999,115** to **\$1,128,131** (**\$129,016** increase)




