

On the Second Sunday of Lent, we have the Gospel of the Transfiguration. The Lord Jesus is revealed in all his glory. It's a side that has not been seen by the disciples; but it's who he truly is. Often times, the Church can distort or hide the realities of our faith. This article by Fr. Dwight Longenecker helps us to see the real point of things...a good reflection on this Second Sunday of Lent.

### **RELIGION: WHAT'S THE POINT?**

We ought to be honest. Catholicism is complicated. It has rules and regulations and rubrics. Not only that, it has an awful lot of stuff to believe. Doctrines and dogmas and devotions and canon law...At times the simple, down to earth, individual faith of the Evangelical Protestant looks attractive. The criticism of the Reformers, of course, was that Catholicism was nothing BUT rules and regulations. They criticized the 1500 year accumulation of traditions, devotions, regulations and strictures mixed with a fair bit of superstition and intentional fraud, flummery and fakery.

I get their point. They wanted to get back to the basics, and that's not necessarily a bad thing. The problem with any revolution, however, is that invariably the revolutionaries feel they must destroy the old order to create their brave new world. The real point of trying to get back to the basics ought to be an effort not to destroy the old order, but to understand it better. An example: instead of destroying statues and icons and beautiful churches we should take the time to understand what they're for, how they help us and what is good about them.

The same goes for all the rules and regulations of religion. It is wearisome at times to find how much some Catholics are attached to the externals of religion. What a fuss some people make over the intricate details of the liturgy, the moral regulations and the devotional details. Don't get me wrong. I'm not saying these things are unimportant. It does matter whether the liturgy is celebrated properly, and it does matter if we observe the moral teachings of the church or not. Canon law matters and so do the doctrines and dogmas and disciplines of the church.

However, while these things matter, there is something that matters more, and that is the end point, the goal and the whole purpose of the Christian religion to start with. Saint Paul wrote: "I have been crucified with Christ, and the life I live now is not my own; Christ is living in me. I still live my human life, but it is a life of faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." This is the end point of our religion: to live in Christ and Christ alive in me. The end point is this astounding transformation—a kind of transubstantiation if you like in which I become a Christian—"a little Christ." This is the work of a moment and the work of a lifetime.

Bit by bit the Holy Spirit chips away all that is not Christ in me, and all the religious stuff are the tools he uses. Why do we take care with the liturgy? Why do we try to pray every day? Why do we read the Sacred Scriptures and the lives of the saints? Why do we do the spiritual and corporal works of mercy? Why do we wear scapula's, light candles, kneel to pray, seek chastity, work for the poor, study and read and pray? None of it is an end in itself. It is a means to an end.

In his rule St Benedict says that at the end of the monk's life he does out of joy what, in the beginning he did as a duty or out of obedience. Practice makes perfect, and this applies to the spiritual life as much as any other pursuit. This is why I am so attracted to the monastic spirituality. The simplicity of the monk's life is one of balance between the rules of religion and the reason for the rules.

While I sometimes become a little bit impatient with the Catholic who is scrupulous and perhaps a bit obsessed with the rules and regulations of religion, I am also disappointed with those who are overly casual, indifferent and even dismissive of the rules and regulations of religion.

All of us should see the rules and regulations for what they are. They are the printed notes on the page, but they are not the music. They are the rules of engagement. They are not the war. They are the principles of painting. They are not the art. They are the ladder on which we climb, but they are not the heaven for which we long and which is our final home.

### PLEDGE REPORT UPDATE | PAGE 1


As a community, we have heard throughout the fall and winter of Father David Mulholland's vision to move our parishes from Maintenance to Mission. Knowing full well the 2019-2020 expenses needed to move us in the Mission-oriented direction would be \$78,391 more than our income from the previous year. Our Finance Council initiated a very intentional strategy to generate this additional revenue from our parishes.

The three-fold strategy included: (1) presenting more detailed and realistic information about parish programs and their true costs; (2) encouraging parishioners who have not given consistently in the past to begin doing so now; and (3) asking households currently giving regularly to consider giving more, if possible.

It was a calculated risk on our part to commit to these additional Mission-oriented expenses but we were confident in the response we would see from our parishes.

### We're grateful to report back to you some very positive news regarding your willingness to financially support your parishes!

- Actual giving from July 2019 December 2019 compared to July 2019 - December 2018 increased by \$48,247
- 142 New Pledges received
- 178 Parishioners increased their pledge amount
- Total dollars pledged increased from \$999,115 to \$1,128,131 (\$129,016 increase)


- **Total Pledge Amount** is not equal to the total amount of contributions actually donated to the church. Many people (approximately 25%) give without completing a pledge card.



## PROTECTING OUR COMMUNITY

Dear parish community,

With an increasing focus on the coronavirus in our local area, we want to assure you that our team continues to monitor the situation. Without causing alarm, we believe it is prudent to remind you of our customary health precautions.

Our response to this spreading virus must reflect how we, as disciples of Jesus, love our neighbor and love God. In caring for all members of our community — especially the elderly and the vulnerable — we are carrying out the mission of the Church. We must do our part to help prevent the spread of the virus.

We strongly urge you to read and follow these recommendations from Archbishop Ettienne out of an abundance of caution:

- If you are sick or feel you are getting sick, stay at home and do NOT attend Mass.
   <u>Missing Mass due to illness is not sinful</u>; it is prudent and shows care for your brothers and sisters.
- 2. During Mass, we will continue to <u>refrain from holding hands with your neighbor during</u> the Lord's Prayer and to refrain from the exchange of the sign of peace during the communion rite. This is actually an optional part of the Mass, and we will simply proceed with the singing of the Lamb of God.
- 3. During Communion, <u>the Eucharist will only be offered in your hand</u>, rather than on the tongue. Additionally, we will continue to <u>refrain from offering the Precious Blood</u> from the chalice at this time.
- 4. You will notice that we have drained the holy water fonts in the church, until further notice. Please simply bless yourself with the sign of the cross as you enter and exit the church.
- 5. Please practice respiratory etiquette and good health hygiene with these recommendations from the CDC: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/about/prevention-treatment.html

Thank you for your attention to these important health precautions. These changes are temporary and should not disrupt the celebration of the Mass. Please let us know if you have any questions.

The children are so filled with joy and peace when they are in the atrium. We are grateful for the ongoing support of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.


