



SUNDAY, MARCH 15TH



Dear Friends in Christ,

When the Lord Jesus encountered people in his ministry, their lives are changed forever. That is true for the Samaritan woman at the well in our Gospel for this Sunday. It's true when Jesus encountered Matthew the tax collector (and all the apostles for that matter), the woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus up in the tree, Mary Magdalen, Martha, and the list goes on. These people, with open hearts, were met by Jesus in their fallen human condition, and with his grace, they were never the same. The Lord Jesus met them with his unconditional love and mercy. And this authentic encounter enabled them to receive his grace and transformative power in their lives. The woman at the well changed her life and became an evangelist. Matthew wrote a gospel. Zacchaeus repented of his sin and engaged in good works. The woman caught in adultery hopefully "sinned no more" and lived a virtuous life, and so on. Jesus changes us.

The question is, do we want to change? Many people, Christians included, simply desire to be affirmed in their present condition. In doing so, they often create God in their own image and likeness. In their minds, they envision a Jesus who affirms and approves of their sins, addictions, pride, and narcissism; without a need to repent or seek the Lord's healing. For them, God's healing is for others and not them. In fact, they very much lack freedom; they are bound and closed off to the action of God in their life.

Well, I believe that is a grave error. I have not met one person who is without the need for the Lord's mercy and healing. At my last parish, a homeless man would often ask for money as people left Mass. His name was Greg, and his appearance would tell you that his life was a wreck. But in speaking to him often, I learned that he had an amazing understanding of God's love and care for him. He knew of God's mercy, justice and healing. In fact, he had more of his life in order than many of the parishioners who by their appearances seemed to have it all in good order. Greg was an amazing witness to me that with an open heart, the Lord Jesus can transform our lives and give us true freedom in those areas of our lives that we are often bound. Yes, he was homeless. But he was truly at home in the love of Christ and he was not shy to share that.

During this journey of Lent, allow yourself to be found by Jesus. As you encounter him, allow him to meet you in your life right where you are and ask him to show you where the change is needed....and then ask for the grace that makes this change a reality.

Dear Parishioners:

April 1, 2020, is Census Day. It is very important for parishes and faith communities of the Archdiocese of Seattle to be involved. Some of the populations we serve are undercounted.

In the next few days, every household will receive an invitation to participate. Upon receiving the invitation, one person from each household should respond in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail. The census will be available in various languages. In May of this year, census takers will begin home visits to those who have not replied between March and April. As mandated by the U.S. Constitution, every person living in the United States, children included, must be counted, regardless of their immigration status. Please respond by participating in the census and encourage your family, friends, and neighbors to do the same.

As members of this parish community and communities in which we live and work, each of us has much at stake as we prepare to respond to the 2020 Census. In the context of a culturally diverse Church with varied pastoral needs, we have a responsibility to know our people and to do what we can to ensure that safety net programs for individuals and families living at or below the poverty line in Western Washington are adequately funded.

The federal government distributes more than \$675 billion to state, local, and tribal governments based on census data. This funding is used for new roads, schools, hospitals, the enhancement of important community programs, and much more. By participating, we can actively affect and improve the quality of life in our community. Data from this national count also helps determine government representation decisions. Faith organizations like ours use census data to apply for grants that fund programs and initiatives that are important to our community.

Your responses are confidential. The 2020 Census form asks 10 questions and takes about 10 minutes to complete. It is easy, important, and safe. By law, the U.S. Census Bureau cannot share an individual's personal information with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.

In a small village in Bihar, in northeast India, lives a boy named Triveni, 11, and his sister Premshila, 13. In India, the lack of education and job opportunities puts children at particular risk for human trafficking for labor or sexual exploitation.



CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

In light of the rapidly changing situation regarding the CoronaVirus, we wanted to share the following information with you that will enable us to keep you better informed of how the outbreak is impacting parish activities, and how things may change or events canceled or rescheduled.

<u>Scheduled Events:</u> To date, the archdiocese does not intend to ask parishes to cancel Masses, but parishes are encouraged to consider postponing non-essential meetings or gatherings.

<u>Enhanced Communication</u>: To facilitate rapid communication regarding potential changes, we encourage every parishioner to: Update your contact information in the parish office; especially email addresses and home and cell phone numbers. This will enable us to contact you quickly and efficiently. Call the parish office or send us an email with your current contact info.

Bookmark our website and "Like" our Facebook page to stay up-to-date on communications.

If you can't make it to Mass, our weekend homilies are recorded and posted.

<u>Communion in the Hand</u>: We will continue to receive Communion in this manner. Parishioners are encouraged to form a small throne with their two hands, upon which the priest or Eucharistic Minister will place the host. And we will continue to refrain from receiving the Most Precious Blood until further notice.

Church Cleanliness: We are taking additional measures to ensure the common areas of the church are cleaned and sanitized.

<u>Continue to Pray:</u> Catholics have always joined together in prayer throughout the ages during times of plague and sickness. Let us continue to pray, especially during this Lenten Season.



We help children learn about the location of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection by showing the City of Jerusalem. We celebrate the Last Supper by reenacting it and hearing, once again, the words of love that Jesus gave us at this meal

"Take, and eat, this is my body, broken for you. Take and drink, this is my blood poured out for you. Do this in memory of me."

The children are so filled with joy and peace when they are in the atrium. We are grateful for the ongoing support of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

We give the definition of ourselves over to so many things. We allow our society, friends, family, work, social groups, ethnicity, and even institutions define, classify, and color how we perceive ourselves. When we listen predominantly to the voices of others, we lose touch with what is happening within our own inner voice. If we listen carefully within. we can easily discover that we are in want and need. We know our incompleteness and also know that loneliness. sadness, and self-images can propel us outward in attempts to fill those gaps. We can become not only victims of our own prejudices but can find ourselves overly self-indulgent in things that can only satisfy for a short time, if at all.

It is no wonder that money and power are things that are so fervently sought after. As long as we can keep a steady supply going, the illusion of fulfillment and satisfaction can falsely persuade us as craftily as a master magician's act. We live with illusions not truth. It is no wonder, then, that some of the wealthiest folks are also really the unhappiest. Whether we admit it, the lies we live and pursue will ultimately expose our superficiality. We all have to wrestle with who we are and what gives our lives purpose and meaning. Learn to listen more deeply, not to what others are saying about you, but to what God is echoing in your heart.

We can easily get confused and misunderstand, not only about who we are but who God is. Even the disciples and the Samaritan woman at the well missed the point Jesus was trying to make. There is only one Person who can satisfy the deepest yearnings and longings of our hearts — Jesus the Messiah. It is not the work of corporate America that will lead us to happiness or greatness but the work of the soul. We continue to resist acknowledging this and are happier in our world of misunderstanding and illusion. The life-giving water we truly need doesn't come from the source of a well but from the Source of Life. Only God can reveal the truth of our sinfulness, the superficiality of our pursuits, and the illusions we hold so dear. Only Jesus can save us from ourselves and give us what we really need. If only our heads can catch up with where our hearts know they need to be, then will we find real contentment and life!



HOLY CROSS SOCIAL HALL ROOF REPAIR- FINAL REPORT TO THE PARISH

In the Fall and Winter of 2016 and 2017 Holy Cross Church Hall experienced sustained water intrusion in the store rooms and kitchen. The Pastoral Council and Finance Council made this a priority for the annual budget. With assistance from Ed Foster, Director of the Seattle Archdiocese Property Management team, Holy Cross took steps to hire a designer to prepare drawings and specifications to fulfill the requirements.

In 2018, three Architects showed interest in the work. Ultimately Nexus Building Envelop Consultants (Todd Wolfe) was selected to develop these drawings, oversee the project, and work with the general and sub-contractors on-site.


The initial cost estimate for repairs was in the range of \$380,000 to \$420,000, which was reviewed and approved by the Pastoral Council. We understood at the time there may be added costs due to the overwhelming amount of construction activity in the Puget Sound region, along with unknown issues that typically arise in projects of this magnitude.

Nexus solicited bids and both Hilger Construction and Collvos Construction submitted bids for the work. Hilger was selected, and after additional consultation and assistance from Ed Foster and Gus Ripple at the Archdiocese Property Office, we drafted and signed the contract for \$365,000.

Prior to work beginning the summer of 2019, display boards approved by the Pastoral Council and prepared by Nexus were placed in the narthex to inform parishioners of the scope of the project and potential disruption to parish life. Throughout the summer, the Parish Council provided ongoing updates on the project along with future phases needed for the clerestory windows and steep sloped shingles. During construction, Nexus field tests of these areas revealed high moisture levels behind the stucco, likely due to the failed existing round window head sealant detail. Consultation between Hilger Construction and Nexus confirmed the need for future phased repairs, as opposed to immediate repairs. Our consultants advised that there were still 3-5 years of useful life in the windows and steep sloped shingles. The deferral of this repair will also give the parish time to set aside funds pay for future repairs.

We are pleased to report back to the parish that the overall project was completed "on time" and "on budget". On December 13, 2019, the project was formally accepted by Nexus, the City of Tacoma, Holy Cross Parish, and the Seattle Archdiocesan Property Group. Hilger's warranty period will carry thru 12/15/2020.

We are grateful to Todd Wolfe and Nexus Consultants for their support and management of the project. Although the scope of the Nexus contract increased by an approved additional \$8,900, this increase was offset by their successful management of the overall contract that ultimately came in \$7,635 under the original \$365,000 bid, resulting in a minimal overage of \$1,265.



We are also grateful for the support and interest of our Holy Cross Pastoral Council members who provided important periodic review of construction activities to ensure the project remained on course and on <u>cost</u>. And we would especially like to thank our own Ron Harpel for generously sharing his architectural expertise throughout the entire project.

Finally, we thank you – our parishioners. Holy Cross Catholic Church is truly blessed. Your many prayers and steady financial support over the years made this possible. Unlike most parishes in the archdiocese who must fund such repairs through loans, our many years of disciplined stewardship enabled Holy Cross to pay our costs from our own parish savings account. It is a parish responsibility to look after our facilities. No one else is going to do that except us. What we did is good - our parish acted in good faith and good stewardship, during a time (market conditions) when architects and contractors were charging a premium for their work. Yet we managed to bring it home on time and on budget.


