6th Grade Homeroom & Middle School Mathematics:

The 6th Grade Homeroom & Middle School Mathematics instructor at Saint Patrick Catholic School is vital in fostering a nurturing and academically enriching environment for students. The teacher is responsible for implementing the school's curriculum, integrating Catholic values into daily lessons, and promoting a love of learning among 6th grade students.

Core Functions or Duties:

Homeroom Leadership

- Serve as the homeroom teacher for a 6th grade class, providing mentorship, guidance, and support to students.
- Foster a positive and inclusive classroom environment where all students feel valued, respected, and safe.
- Lead morning meetings, facilitate community-building activities and address students' social and emotional needs.

Middle School Mathematics Instruction

- Develop and implement engaging and differentiated lesson plans aligned with 6th-grade math and pre-algebra curriculum standards.
- Utilize a variety of instructional strategies and resources to accommodate diverse learning styles and abilities.
- Provide targeted support and enrichment opportunities to ensure all students can succeed in pre-algebra.
- Assess student understanding through formative and summative assessments and adjust instruction accordingly.

Elective Course Instruction

• Develop course outlines, instructional materials, and instruct two elective classes, ensuring alignment with educational goals and standards.

Classroom Management & Student Support

- Establish and communicate clear expectations for behavior, participation, and academic performance in all classes.
- Implement effective classroom management strategies to maintain a positive and productive learning environment
- Provide academic support and guidance to students, offering extra help sessions or resources as needed.
- Collaborate with specialists and other staff members to address students' individual needs and challenges.

Communication & Collaboration

 Maintain open and regular communication with students, parents, and colleagues, providing updates on student progress, upcoming events, and school policies.

- Collaborate with other teachers and staff members to integrate homeroom activities, math instruction, and elective courses into a cohesive educational experience.
- Participate in faculty meetings, professional development opportunities, and parent-teacher conferences as required.

Qualifications/Competencies:

- Bachelor's degree in Education, Mathematics, or related field.
- Washington State teaching certification
- Strong understanding of 6th-grade math and pre-algebra curriculum standards and instructional strategies.
- Experience working with middle school students and fostering a supportive learning environment.
- Excellent communication, organizational, and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues, students, and families.
